The tip-off that something drastic had happened in
Syria - was the way the Syrian radio identified itself this morning. The usual words are - "This is the radio of the United Arab Republic." But when it came on the air this morning, the words were - "This is Radio Damascus." The obvious interpretation - the Syrians asserting their independence against

Egypt. And that turned out to be - the correct interpretation.
Syrian generals, attempting - an anti-Nasser coup.

Seizing the radio station - broadcasting appeals to the people. Appeals to the nationalism - that has always been so strong in

Syria. The Damascus mob, answering today - with massive street demonstrations. Tearing down U.A.R. flags - and pictures of

Nasser. Shouting - for independence.
The strong man of Egypt promptly took to the air
himself - in a broadcast beamed into Syria. Nasser, calling on the Syrian people to remain loyal - to the union with Egypt. Ordering a Syrian army to march : I Damascus - put down the

First reports had it - that Nasser was being obeyed. But later word was that the revolt - had flared up again. The problem is that Syria is almost entirely sealed off - from the rest of the world. So we have no way of getting a direct answer to the question - of whether or not the U.A.R. is tottering; Whether or not Nasser is facing the callable of the political union - he devised.

## U.N.

Britain and America are asking the U.N. to apply pressure - to the Soviet Union. The joint resolution, asking for a condemnation of - atomic testing. And a motion - that the Geneva test ban talks be resumed forthwith. This resolution will be debated first - in the U.N. political committee. If approved, it will go - to the floor of the General Assembly.

Red China, is getting a big dose of - radioactive
fallout. So says Robert List, an American weather man - who specializes in climatology. Dr. List, stating his argument in three parts. First, Soviet scientists recently touched off tremendous atomic explosions - at their testing grounds in central Asia and the Arctic. Secondly, the winds are blowing from both sites - into Red China. Third, it's raining in Red China - and rain is a major carrier of fallout.

I wonder what Mao Tse-tung -- thinks of that. Nuclear Nikita Kturnahehev, fallout, compliments of this rival for leadership of the red empire, Hiktta-Khraeheher.

The late secretary-General of the U.N. received today
tributes from one of the newest institutions in the world;
And - from one of the oldest. Dag Hammarskjold, commemorated at the U.N. in New York - and at the medieval cathedral in Uppsala, Sweden.

The U.N. played its last respects at a memorial service-
in the hall of the General Assembly. The delegates heard a
recording of Hammarskjold's voice - speaking on the philosophy of the U.N., Emphasizing the position of the Secretary-General as a representative of all the nations. The memorial service, concluding with - Bethoven's triumphant Ninth Symphony.

Meanwhile, over in Sweden, the remains of the U. 1 I.

Swedish statesman - were being driven in a hearse from Stockholm to Uppsala. The coffin, carried into Uppsala
Cathedral - with its vaulted Gothic architecture; Paid on the altar - in preparation for the funeral tomorrow. The funeral
of - Dag Hammarskjold.

The Philippine Islands may break diplomatic relations -
with Cuba. This, following charges by - a former attache at the Cuban Embassy in Manila. Freire Gonzales defected because he couldn't stand any more of Castro's Communism. Gonzales, charging that the Manila Embassy is a headquarters for - Communist propaganda; And a campaign to destroy democracy - in the Philippines. Hence the possibility that Manila will send home - the Ambassador from Havana.
