President Nixon has refused to provide any additional Watergate materials - either to the House Committee or to special prosecutor Leon Jaworski; a decision relayed to the public - by White House lawyer James St. Clair. And the start of historic impeachment proceedings by the House Judiciary Committee - is set for Thursday afternoon. Committee chairman Peter Rodino saying the panel will focus initially - on the Watergate burglaries and subsequent cover-up. The hearings to be closed at first but later opened to the public and radio and TV. If all goes as planned to continue on through the end of June - said Chairman Rodino.
