EAST GERMANY

The East German legislature is going to pass a law - to halt the exodus of refugees to the West. So announced - in the Red press. Needless to say, its being done - in typical Communist style. Beginning with - these phoney reports of mass demonstrations. The Communist regime, said to have received - a flood of demands by the people of the Soviet satellite. Demands - that the refugees be kept at home. Home -in East Germany where they last want to be,

What the Red regime doesn't announce - is the effect of the mass flight. So many able bodied men have disappeared west - that an entire complex of industrial plants may have to be closed down. Not enough workers. East Germany, sinking deeper into an economic crisis - because so many of its people are in flight to freedom. East Germany, preparing to stop the flight - by legislation -- if that's possible.

The Portuguese government announces a key rebel stronghold in Angola. A stronghold with a rather impressive name - Nambuan-Gongo. Also - an impressive defense. Surrounded by the towering mountains of northern Angola - some of the toughest terrain in the world. took the Portuguese army almost a month - to push through the mountains to Nambuan-Gongo. Three columns, converging on the fortress -- which was held by several thousand native Angolans. But they couldn't minimal up to - the fire power of a modern army. Not when they had to use old fashiened rifles - against machine guns. The attackers stormed in after inflicting heavy losses on the defenders. Tonight, ance more the Portuguese in possession of - Nambuan-Gongo, in the mountains of Angola.

One of the interesting things President Kennedy said at his news conference today - concerned his own status. The question of what to do - should he become incapacitated. The answer - the same as that reached by President Eisenhower and Vice President Nixon. Vice President Johnson, to take over as "Acting President," if Mr. Kennedy no longer could fulfill the office of President. The Vice President, to act with the advice of the cabinet - if they are available.

But Now's empowered to make his own decision - without waiting to confer with anyone else.

The rest of today's presidential news conference covered the obvious points. Atomic testing? President Kennedy's scientific advisors have told him - that atomic explosions cannot be effectively policed from mm outside the Soviet Union. Hence, the President is sending his representative back to Geneva - for one more try at an agreement with the Russians.

One odd thing about that hijacked airliner is that Castro's government made a mistake in identifying the gunman. Havana radio, repeatedly naming - Hector Vioni, an attorney from Richmond, Indiana. The assertion, astonishing the people of Richmond - who know mector Vioni as a dignified, responsible member of the legal profession. Said one of his colleagues at the Indiana bar - "Hector is the last man in the world to hijack a plane."

So - why the wrong identification in Havana? No one knows. But the American attorney was on the plane - and somehow Castro's men tapped him for the star part.

At any rate, the hijacker - turned out to be

Albert Cadon, born in France - a waiter in New York,
a man who has been under mental observation. That's a

point President Kennedy noted at his news conference-when

he said that unstable people must be prevented from

seizing planes in the sky. The President, putting border

patrolmen /aboard some airliners - to stop these dangerous incidents before they begin.

At the same time, the Senate has approved a bill to deal with hijackers. Providing penalties - ranging from
twenty years in jail, to death.

Where will it all end? Probably with - a new statute for the books of intermtional law. America is not the only nation disturbed by - this novel crime of the Twentieth Century. Castro today suggested an agreement on hijackers - between Havana and Washington. Which reflects Castro's concern over- the attempted hijacking of a Cuban plane. And the concern is widespread, - throughout the free transfer.

The nations, apparently are about to come together - just as they did in the age of piracy. Only this time its air put piracy.
