A surprise political move tonight - a behind-the scenes maneuver torpedoing the plans of Harold Stassen.

It was Stassen, you'll recall, who recommended

Governor Werter of Massachusetts as President Eisenhowers

running mate, replacing Vice President Nixon.

This touched off a political storm, the like of which the capitol hadnt seen for months, and reached Hurricame proportions until the sudden collapse tonight.

Then, G.O.P. Chairman Leonard Hall announced dramatically that Governor Herter will be the man who nominates Vice President Nixon for re-election at the San Francisco convention.

Political observers say this makes it certain that Herter is not available for the role in which Stassen would like to cast him.

And - Stassen's own political future is being argued in the capitol - on the basis of the question - did President Eisenhower snub Stassen as he returned to Washington from Panama?

Neither side is commenting on that.
