SUBMARINE LT.- Olds. Thea. May 10th. 60.

A new Magellan - Captain Edward Beach, of Palo Alto, California, skipper - of the atomic submarine, Triton, which, today, completed a voyage that included - the first under-water circumnavigation of the globe. The undersea craft, submerged, as it followed, closely, the course that Magellan took more than four hundred years ago.

At the White House, today, President Eisenhower pinned the Legion of Merit on Captain Beach, an old friend - incidentally. The Captain - having served for a while as President Eisenhower's naval aide at the White House. The submarine veteran - also a distinguished author, who, several years ago, turned out a best selling novel of the undersea, "Run Silent, Run Deep."

The Triton, the largest of submarines, began its voyage - February Sixteenth. Proceeding - to St.Paul's Rocks - off the eastern tip of Brazil. That point - considered the official beginning of the circumnavigation.

The sub - then steering south, along the coast of

South America. Off the coast of Uruguay - a predicament.

A petty officer - stricken with a painful illness. So the

Triton came to the surface - where the patient was taken off

by helicopter. The only time the submarine surfaced - in the

course of the under-water circumnavigation.

The course - around Cape Horn, and across the Pacific. Passing near the Philippines, near Magellan Bay - where the first circumnaxisationxmax circumnavigator was killed. Then - across the Indian Ocean, and around Cape of Good Hope, back to St. Paul's Rocks - off Brazil.

After which the Triton, still submerged - made a pilgrimage, crossing the Atlantic - to Cadiz. The port - from which Magellan sailed under the Spanish flag, in Fifteen Nineteen. There the atomic sub came to the surface - in a ceremony of homage to Magellan.

The whole submerged voyage - taking 831 days. The Triton surfaced - twelve miles off Delaware, where Captain Beach was taken off by helicopter, and flown to the White House, to

receive - presidential honors.

A great exploit, and a boost for American prestige/.

Performed by the submarine the crew. Commanded - by the undersea Magellan.

In Congress, today -- an insistent opinion.that the American reconnaissance plane was not shot down by a Russian rocket, but was captured, undamaged -- after it came down for some accidental reason. Khrushchev -- giving a false account, which he tries to prove -- by bringing forward some undetermined wreckage.

This is an opinion given -- by Congressman

Cannon of Missouri -- and Senator Dirksen of Illinois,

who -- sat in on the White House discussion of the

incident. One point being -- that Khrushchev must be

worried about the amount if information obtained by

American observation planes.

Today, the StateDepartment made a declaration that we will stand by our Allies -- in the face of Khrushchev's threats. That the Soviets might bomb air bases in Allied countries -- from which American surveillance planes have been flying But, on the

other hand, with all his bluster, the Soviet Premier is taking a mild, peaceful tone about the Summit Conference, beginning on Monday. Assuring the Western powers -- that this latest uproar should not impede the take among the Chiefs of State.

The circus that Khruschchev is making of that aerial espionage affair -- was indicated by preparations in Moscow, today, to put the wreckage of the jet (or what passes for it) observation plane, the U-2, -- on exhibition in a Moscow park. Inside a large hall -- one of the best-known places in Moscow. There, today, a broken wing of the plane, together with items of equipment -- was taken, to be put on display for the public -- tomorrow.

Inside the the exhibition hall, the walls are decorated with figures of the game of Chess -- King,

Knight, Rook. In fact, the place is named -- Chess Hall.

Where, only recently, the max match for the championship of the world was played. On Crowning a new Chess hall.

Seems like an appropriate place -- for

Khruschchev's propaganda show. Suggesting -- that, in

this aerial espionage uproar, he's playing a game.

Soviet Russia - to put Pilot Francis Powers on trial. That's the word - following the receipt of a Moscow note, in Washington today. A protest - against that reconnaissance flight, which ended so badly.

But, actually, the Soviet communication does not use the word "trial." Stating that Powers, in the words of the note - "will be brought to account." Which would seem to mean - legal prosecution, on a charge - of espionage.

However, a Moscow dispatch might raise a doubt about what it all means. Foreign observers pointing out - that, in a matter of espionage, Soviet law is decidedly flexible. Moscow opinion being - that the case might be settled without any formal trial.

Soviet officials have promised American diplomatic representatives - that they may soon have a chance to talk to Pilot Francis Powers, who is quoted by Communist

newspapers as declaring - that he took the reconnaissance

assignment because it paid so well.

Wanting - to buy some property and build a home for his family.

Retiring Governor Earl Long attended the inauguration, and was -- in jovial mood. Waving -- a fistful of bandana-handkerchiefs, red, white and blue.

"Get out of here," he yelled - and screamed wild curses.

The reporter departing - followed by a stream of blazing language.

Anyway, Louisiana now has a Governor, Dick, who sings hillbilly songs. A little more melodious, perhaps?

At the Sicilian town of Catania, Giuseppe Barbieri cannot walk through a closed door. In fact, Giuseppe has bumps on his head for trying.

Yet he paid all of sixty-five dollars - to learn how.

Taking lessons - from a local magician, who taught him words of witchcraft - and miracle medicine. Which would enable him - to walk right through any door, no matter - how well it was locked.

Giuseppe tried it repeatedly - at a chapel in a cemetery. Trying to walk - through a massive door. But, each time - bang! He'd collide with the door - to no effect.

Whereupon a mysterious voice inside would say - he didn't use the magical formula correctly.

Finally, Giuseppe became suspicious - notifying the police, who found that the mysterious voice - was produced by a confederate of the magician.

Giuseppe deciding - that hereafter he'll open a door, before - trying to walk through.
