GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY :

Around the world tonight, eyes are focused on -Laos. Anxiety as to whether "Laos is about to become another Korea?"

First, the news from Vientiane - the Laotian capital. We are told that Red invaders have crossed the border - in force. Savage fighting is said to be raging - in the border provinces. And the Communists are claiming - great victories. But so far - Laos has not asked her allies for military aid.

In nearby Bangkok, in Thailand - the Seato Council agrees that there is Red intervention in Laos. The magnitude of the intervention - not clear. What will Seato's strategy be - as this crisis develops? So far no answer to that. The attitude of the member nations appears to be - wait and see. LEAD - 2

In London, the tendency is to minimize the size of the Communist invasion of Laos. The British government thinks it's a mome a matter of - small guerrilla bands siding the Laotian rebels. That is no invasion by any sizeable force.

In Washington, our government is taking the situation - more seriously. Today President Eisenhower conferred with Secretary of State Herter - about the possibility of using American troops for a Korea-style action. We have the men for the job - aboard our tank force in the China Sea. The question is - whether they should be sent into Laos.

In Moscow, Khrushchev is calling for - a renewal of the International Commission that presided over the end of the Indo-Chinese war in Mineteen Fifty-Four. Washington is cool to the Khrushchev plan - because we don't want to see action in Laos hampered by a Red veto. LEAD - 3

Widespread concern over what is happening in Southeast Asia.

CHINA

Tonight we have the scientific explanation - of the latest drought in Red China. The Chinese earth parched and dry. The wind - blowing up a titanic dust bowl. The prediction is that this year's crop will be so poor that some sixty million Chinese face famine, and starvation.

Reports filtering into Hong Kong from Red China give the basic reason. Once more it's the Yellow River. Much of North China depends on the Yellow - to irrigage the soil. But theriver is only a fraction of its usual size. The Yellow River rises far to the West - on the Plateau of Tibet, where for the past six months there has been almost no rain. Tributaries drying up, so the Yellow River is a river of sorrow once again.

An ironic twist. Red China persecuting - Tibet. And, faces disaster from Nature - via Tibet.

BELG IUM

In Belgium - the truce between battles. That's any calling the calm what they re saying about the quiet - that has prevailed over the holidays. The only demonstrations - peaceful. But nobody expect this truce - to last. Not with the Socialists threatening a general strike. And the Reds "trying to seize control of this crists - and force Belgium into Chaos.

One tip - off on the anxiety among the Belgians people - housewives are buying up stocks of food. Preparing to sit it out at home, instead of going to theet market - should there be any more rioting, in the street. And, rioting is predicted - for tomorrow.

Today King Baudouin conferred with Premier Eyskens - about government strategy. The Premier, describing new precautionary measures - special **pi** police units, tanks at key **pizzz** places in the big cities, a possible curfew, and so on. The King, said to be in full agreement that his government must act vigorously now ->
