Thirty-five-thousand American fighting men-and four squadrons of U. S. combat planes-coming home soon from West Germany; by virtue of a major military cutback-announced today by the State Department.

The pullout amounts to about Aifteen per cent-of all
American troops currently etectioned in West Germany.

And it follows a recent decision by Britain-to recell
tem per cent of its own fifty-thousand man force there

Both moves in an effort to ease balance of payments

deficit-that has plagued Washington and London for years.

Ironically, Russia and her East European allies—
have recently strengthened their forces facing the Iron
Curtain. U. S. officials insist however that the pullout
will have no significant effect—on NATO defenses.

Asserting—in other words—That we can still cope with
any possible Communist attack in Europe.
