But - with grim shadows in the background. The insurgent regime moving to take vengence on the henchmen of the fallen dictator,

Batista. New President Urrutia - announcing that they'll be tried as war criminals. Urrutia citing the precendent of the Nuremberg trials of Nazi war criminals. Thirteen hundred suspected followers of Batista - arrested in Havana alone.

Reports are that at least twenty military and police officers of the former government - have been court-martialed and

cash out of the country, when the Strong Man was overthrown.

One of the three vessels was Batista's presidential yacht.

So, a search was made at Key West. But - no seventeen million bucks. Although the Customs authorities did find ninety-two thousand -- in the possession of three high ranking Cuban naval officers. Who - were aboard the Batista yacht.

Washing to The battle in the Senate - put off until tomorrow.

As a result, the Senate voted unanimously - to put the voting and the talking off until tomorrow.

Republic, today. He, himself - the creator of the Fifth

Republic. The new regime in which exceptional powers are vested in the President.

After which President DeGaulle named a Premier to form a new

Cabinet. His choice - as expected. Michel Debre - a long time

DeGaulle follower, won't be bothered by problems of lining

up a majority in the National Assembly - where the DeCaullists

have an overwhelming majority.

Cairo reports an air battle between Egyptian and Israeli marplanes. A clash in the sky - above the Sinai peninsula. Cairo claiming - that six Israeli jets invaded Egyptian air space. One - shot down and another damaged.

In combat - with Egyptian jets.

on the Israeli side, the statement is - that Israeli jets intercepted four Egyptian Migs near Beersheba, Israeli territory. The Egyptian planes - The back to Egyptian territory, after a brief skirmish in the air. The Israeli report makes no mention - of anything shot down.

## MIKOYAN

President Eisenhower, today, called on Americans - to preserve good manners toward Mikoyan. The President disturbed by the hostile demonstrations against the Moscow Deputy Premier in Cleveland. The throwing - of rocks and eggs.

Today, Mikoyan was in Detroit. Where a party of pickets - was waiting for him. People - from European countries under Communist oppression.. But, this time - the pickets were outwitted.

They were parading on the airport parking lot, where they supposed - Mikoyan would have to take an automobile. But, instead, the plane aboard which he came - taxied up to a big hangar. Mikoyan and his party - going inside. Automobiles - then driving in, and picking them up. So Mikoyan was on his way into Detroit - without the pickets ever having got a glimpse of him.

He made a tour of inspection at the Ford River Rouge plant - and, tonight, is a guest at a reception attended by top flight industrialists, business men, and financiers.

The Mikoyan visit has caused a rift - between labor leaders. Some difference of opinion - at least.

On Tuesday, two Vice-Presidents of the AFL-CIO had lunch with the Moscow Deputy Premier. Walter Reuther and James B. Carey - in a meeting with Mikoyan.

George Meany, President of the AFL-CIO. Addressing a labor-science conference in Washington, a called Mikoyan - "an old-time Stalinist, who perpetrated the greatest double-cross in modern civilized history." Which referred, of course, to the leading part Mikoyan played - in the crushing of the Hungarian revolt. When leaders of the freedom fighters were lured into conference. Then - treacherously arrested.

A dispatch from Moscow gives us a curious kind of a simile - a figure of speech. You know how it is, when you wax eloquent, and try to think of a comparison.

In Washington, a prediction - that Soviet Russia is likely to put an atomic plane in the air, this year.
