Five times since the New Year's truce - the United

States has appealed secretly to Hanoi for peace talks on Viet

Nam. And five times the appeal was ignored - or else

rejected.

The latest regarding futile American peace offensives coming to light today, with North Vietnamese president

Ho Chi Minh - flatly and publicly refusing the final peace offer, contained in the form of a personal letter from President Johnso- when all else had failed.

The President assuring Ho - that the U.S. would stop bombing North Vietnam and also stop its troop buildup in South Vietnam, if Ho would only give his assurance in return - to stop "infiltration into South Vietnam by land and by sea."

In reply - Ho accusing the United States of "war crimes against peace, against mankind." Further setting a bomb halt - as the first condition for any future peace conference.

Ho declaring: "Vietnam will never submit to talks - under the threat of bombing."

Some of the fiercest fighting of the war is reported today from Vietnam. Troops of the U.S. Fourth Infantry

Division - decimating a Viet Cong regiment of nearly fifteen hundred men; in a furious battle - near the Cambodian border.

Remnants of the Viet Cong finally fleeing bach into safe sanctuary across the frontier, leaving behind - some four-hundred and twenty dead. Raising enemy losses to more than seven hundred men - in two days of fighting in that war zone.

C. Thereby crushing Hanoi's hopes for a propaganda victory - during the President's trip to Guam.

The nation's economy - is reported "slowing at the moment." But the outlook for business in the months ahead extremely good, according to word today - from Chairman William McChesney Martin of the Federal Reserve Board in testimony before a Senate committee - Martin endorsing the President's proposed tax increase; calling the requested tax boost - insurance against the danger of future inflation and tight money. Threatened - said he - by the fact "that we are still fighting a war; and that a resurgence in economic activity is the most likely prospect - as Nineteen-Sixty-Seven progresses. "the ust before it delike exhere. This to bean

More trouble today - off the coast of Penzance,

In the meantime - oil from the stricken vessel - now covering an area roughly twenty by thirty-five miles, with an armada of ships attempting to treat the giant oil slick with more than three million gallons of emulsifier; that is trying to dissipate the oil before it drifts ashore. This to head off the threat of economic chaos - for seaside resort areas.

Three residents of Turin, Italy - arrested today by

Italian counter espionage agents; two men and a woman
allegedly in the pay of the Soviet Union. They are charged

with spying on NATO bases - in Italy and Spain. Two Soviet

diplomats stationed in Italy - also implicated in the spy ring.

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Jour liver- to the last two manths along.

Three men who make up a special United Nations commission were in conference with British officials today in London. Envoys from Venezuela, Mali and Afghanistan - weighing the tense situation in Aden and the neighboring federation of South Arabia; trying to determine how best to ease the transition - from British colonial status to full independence.

Among the considerations - are some death threats
against all members of the commission; should they go ahead
with plans to visit Aden and South Arabia - later this month.

Even as they met - there was a new wave of terroriet bombings in Aden; with a total of forty explosions during the night and early this morning. Rival Arab nationalists apparently stepping up their campaign - against each other and the British. A wave of terror that has claimed forty-four lives- in the last two months alone.

Another compromise was put forward today - at that continuing Geneva Disarmament Conference. The United States offering a five-point plan - to soften the impact of a nuclear non-proliferation treaty; by assuring future benefit from peaceful nuclear explosions to those countries presently without any nuclear capability.

Under the U.S. proposal - countries possessing nuclear weapons would make them available to non-muclear states for peaceful explosions; whenever such explosions - ecome technically and economically feasible. Each detonation - to be under strict international supervision.

With the nuclear device remaining under custody and control - of whichever nuclear power performs the service.

The conference will adjourn Thursday for six waeks to permit consultation on the new plan now offered in
conjunction with an earlier joint Soviet and Americ an draft
of the proposed treaty.

America's three lost astronauts - could well have survived that recent tragedy at Cape Kennedy, if only their space ship had contained escape equipment - currently standard in Soviet space craft. This according to Russian spacewoman Valentina Nikolayeva-Tereshkova - in an article published today in Moscow.

Valentina saying that Soviet space capsules - are equipped with explosive, quick opening hatches and jet propelled ejection seats. Powerful enough to hurl a Russian cosmonaut - a distance of a hundred and fifty yards from his space ship. A parachute completing the job - of returning the space man safely to earth.

Meanwhile, the investigation continues here at home in an effort to determine the cause of that disaster in Apollo
One. This amid reports that design of the moon capsule
will soon be altered - so that it, too, will have quick
opening hatches.

That annual invasion from college students is currently underway today at Fort Lauderdale, Florida, with an estimated ten thousand campus out-ups already on hand - and more arriving every minute; to an expected total of about forty-thousand by the weekend - not to mention seventy-thousand more at nearby Daytona Beach.

Among the early arrivials - a group supposedly interested in civic justice. Its members attending en masse - a hearing before Judge Steven Booher. Found missing when they left: a "No Smoking" sign - a rubber stamp for marking evidence - !he judge 's nameplate - the judge's gavel - and a sign reading "Women" - taken from the doornext to one marked "Men".

Warren, a local policeman later bemoaning the invasion of the "college kids" - when he was interrupted by one of same. Said the youngster: "There ain't no college kids here, baby - we're all CIA men."

A bit of a flop today - in jolly old London; with

British and Swedish officials alike - protesting the

treatment of a twenty-year-old Swedish student. Pretty

Barbro Eriksson - who was ordered to strip to the waist;

during a customs inspection - on her arrival in England for an Easter holiday.

Twin investigations by both countries - are already underway. With the British Home Office - doing its best to explain away the incident; saying that a doctor and a woman immigration officialwere both present when Miss Eriksson was ordered to strip. Adding that such a check is a, quote "valid investigation" - under Britain's Alien Control Act.
