This latest on the epic trans-Atlantic voyage of Robert Manry, The self-made sailor from Cleveland and his thirteen foot sailboat - the Tinkerbelle - sighted today for the first time in a week. Less than a hundred miles from their goal - of Falmouth, England.

A British trawler - first on the scene. -- a British minesweeper - then a flotilla of welcoming boats from Falmouth. One of them - bearing Manry's wife Virginia - whom he had not seen since the start of his voyage, Two and a half months - and more than three thousand miles ago.

A tremendous nico civic celebration + awaiting Manry at Falmouth, When he finally completes his test of endurance and seamanship. If all goes well - maybe tomorrow.

Rioting and looting in Los Angeles & replaced today by a form of guerilla warfare. Hit and run snipers and fire-bombers - striking at suburban white neighborhoods, Previously untouched - in the city's six days of racial strife.

California Governor Brown summing up the situation -- in these words; - "The worst is over" said he - "but we must and will continue to deal forcefully with the terrorists - until Los Angeles box n is safe again."

A major concession today - at the United Nations.

The United States finally backing down - on its demand

that Russia pay its U N dues - or lose its vote.

Arthur Goldberg declaring in his first U N

speech - that the U S is now willing to bow - to the obvious

will of the majority of U N members, Rather than risk

wrecking - the whole world organization.

The US statement - ending a year of crisis.

In which the United Nations was unable even to meet - let alone pay its bills, For fear of causing a major confrontation -- between East and West.

On the other side of the globe - Communist terrorists today bombed South Viet Nam's national police headquarters in Saigon. Sa Killing four police men and injuring twenty-one other persons - six as of them Americans.

Two pretty Vietnamese women - serving to

distance distract guards, So that two carloads of terrorists

could die drive through an open gate into the pas police

compound. The Communists leaping out and escaping on

foot - as their cars exploded on impact with the main

physic police building.

The daring daylight raid described as the most brazen Communist attack - since the bombing of a floating restaurant last June, When forty-two were killed and eighty wounded in the very trait heart of Saigon.

The weather at Cape Kennedy and around the world -was declared near-perfect today, for Thursday's scheduled
launch -- of the Gemini-Five space probe.

There are two possible threats -- both being watched:

One -- typhoon Mary -- meandering across the Pacific. The

other -- an easterly wave in the Atlantic -- possibly the

fore-runner of a hurricane. Space officials say -- however,

that "at present" -- neither of these "is expected to affect

the launch decision."

As for Astronauts Cooper and Conrad -- they are also fit and ready for their eight-day ordeal in space. Then, after that -- to the moon and beyond.

In Moscow - the Soviet Union today published an unprecedented series of photographs - of the back side of the moon. Covering an area of about five million square distant kilometers - never before seen by man - or camera.

The photos detailing in sharp contrast - what
the Russians called a vast lunar "continent" - surrounded
by waterless "seas". As seen last month by a Russian
Zond-Three spacecraft - enroute to an orbit around the
sun.

The British government today banned a performance of the Soviet Bolshoi ballet - scheduled for London next month. Under terms of the British and Russian agreement-on the exchange of cultural relations.

The performance in question - scheduled as a benefit for Lord Bertrand Russell's peace foundation.

Which has long been associated with left-wing causes - in Britain.

This entirely "inappropriate" - say the British, in as much as exchange xxitxx artists - are forbidden from appearing in support of any movement of xp a political character. Or from involving themselves in the internal affairs - of the host xxxxxxx country.

A Chilean Air Force helicopter - today picked up twenty-seven survivors of the Chilean Coast Guard Cutter Janequeo, Battered to bits yesterday in raging seas - about five hundred miles south of Santiago.

But fifty-two additional crewmen still missing, and presumed dead, In what now ranks as the worst peace-time disaster - in Chilean naval history.

Meanwhile, the rest of Chile in a virtual state of emergency, As the result of a week of violent storms & that have killed more than a hundred and thirty persons, And have left more than fifty thousand - homeless.

At New Delhi - Indian troops, said today to have reoccupied two outposts - in the neutral zone of Kashmir—that were given given up early this summer - at the request of the United Nations.

Reoccupation necessary - said India's Defense

Minister - to prevent a take-over by Pakistani "infiltrators"

intent on seizing control - of the disputed area.

The outposts vial - he added - to protect

the Indian supply line from Kashmir - to the neighboring

state of Ladakh. Where Indian troops stand eye-ball to

eye-ball with the Red Chinese.
