Good Evening Everybody:

The feeling at the U.N. headquarters in
the Congo tonight, is that the Congo problem may
be close to a solution. A solution - minus Tshombe.

The leader of secessionist Katanga, now so
discredited - so they think at the U.N. - that

Leopoldville may ignore him when the new Congo
constitution is drawn up.

This as a result of the U.N. invasion of

Katanga. The international army, capturing the mining center of Jadotville - after a brief battle. Then plunging on toward Kolwezie - the last stronghold in front of Tshombe's capital at Elizabethville. The Katanga army, retreating in disarray.

> The rich province, now apparently to
be brought back into a unified Congo, with Tshombe or without him.

But there is criticism in the west -
especially in Britain - of this U.N. operation.

And Secretary General U -Thant has ordered

Ralph Bunche to fly to the Congo, on fact-finding mission.

Westerners in Moscow hope the Soviet

Foreign Ministry meant what it said to those would-
be refugees - who tried to find asylum at the

American Embassy. "Nothing will happen to you"
said a Soviet official to the group of Evangelical

Christians. But they didn't believe him.

The thirty-two men, women and children
traveled two thousand miles from Siberia to Moscow.

To escape persecution by the Reds they said. Their
hope - to gain asylum in western Embassy and then
find a permanent home in the West beyond the Iron

Curtain. They chose the American Embassy.

Unfortunately our policy is to refuse
asylum to Soviet citizens. And so the refugees were placed in a bus and driven out of the Embassy grounds. The one hope for their safety - that
promise by the Kremlin spokesman - nothing will
happen to you". We wonder.

The Russian Bear didn't stop the U S Army today but the Russian winter did. An American military convoy, clearned for the run to West Berlin - in record time. The Soviet border guards - rarely looking at their papers. Then waving them through the checkpoints.

Nevertheless, the trucks of the convoy - were three
hours late when they reached West Berlin. They had been slowed to a crawl - by snow, ice and frozen fuel lines. Europe, still in the grip of frigid weather - blowing west from the Steppes of Russia.

Italy's U-2 case in reverse" - was nothing of the
kind. So ruled by the Judge in Bari - who released Lieutenant Milusk Solakov of the Bulgarian Air Force.

Last January, Solakov crash-landed near Bari. He
claimed - that he was fleeing to the west. The Bulgarian
government claimed - that he lost his way. But some skeptics
in Italy claimed - that he was photographing Nato
installations. A high-level espionage mission - or "U-2
case in reverse."

The judge says "no" - because the Bulgarian plane had only routine photographic equipment; And not have enough fuel to return to base.

> Hence - Pilot Solakov is a free man tonight.

American military commanders in South Diet Nam Nat because of admit they are angry tonight. Hor it's not the fart beria that the Vietnamese army was defeated; by the Red guerrillas. It's the way - they were beaten.

The loyalists, ferried to the battlefield - in

Besides, the Secretary of Defense hopes that a rise in the wage scale - will induce more men to make a career in the armed forces.
