Setback at Paris. As you may have heard by now today's first free exchange of peace views ended in failure - at least, on the surface. For seven and a half hours - North Vietnamese and Viet Cong negotiators turning back every American peace move.

Both sides agreeing "no progress."

## SAIGON FOLLOW PARIS

Saigon reports a sharp increase in Viet Cong terrorist attacks and abduction of some eleven hundred South Vietnamese civilians - over the past week. This seen as a demonstration of Communist "muscle" - perhaps in preparation for another major offensive.

### PENTAGON FOLLOW SAIGON

Here at home - Defense Secretary Melvin Laird was also speculating on the possibility of a new TET offensive. U.S. and South Vietnamese troops are keeping up the pressure said he, in hopes of disrupting any concerted attack. Adding, in any event, "we can contain such an offensive."

Secretary Laird also said he plans to visit the war zone soon.

### MIDDLE EAST

The Middle East - again at flash point tonight. With Radio Baghdad charging an attack by Israeli jets - on Iraqi forces in Jordan. Jerusalem firing back - that the charge is an obvious attempt to cover up for turmoil back in Iraq.

As for the two Americans held in Baghdad, still no word as to why. Meanwhile, a report from Cairo - that the United States has asked Egypt to intervene in their behalf.

#### DULLES

From Washington we hear of the death of master spy Allen W. Dulles - but he was far more than that. The former head of the CIA - an expert at the craft of intelligence for more than fifty years, in the end - the victim of complications resulting from flu and pneumonia.

Allen Dulles' first introduction to the mysterious world of espionage was back in Nineteen Sixteen when he served as a U.S. dippense diplomatic officer at Bern, Switzerland - a World War One center for spies and counter spies. He later joined the office of Strategic Services during World War Two, then head of the C I A during the Eisenhower years; while his brother, the late John Foster Dulles, was also serving lke as Secretary of State.

His greatest adventures along the way are still top secret of course. Even so, he was cited for

valor by both the French and Belgian governments as well as by his own. But the accolade he appreciated perhaps best - that from the Kremlin; which once said

if he ever got to Heaven - "he would blow up the clouds, mine the stars and slaughter the angels." Where black is white and white is black **them** that was the supreme compliment.

During my own lifetime there have been a few things about which I delighted to boast. One of these was that at The Princeton Graduate Bohook College where I went to study Constitutional Law, under the number one authority, Professor Corwin, there were just two of us in the class. The other student's name was Dulles, and he was definitely **to** the head of the class! Later Allen became an important person in the State Department, where his grandfather had been Secretary as was of State; also his uncle Mr. Lansing, and his brother John Foster. Leaving the State Department he became one of the heads of the top New York law firm of Sullivan and Cromwell.
