*From Peking - a blast today at the U.S. - said to be the stiffest since the reopening of U.S. - Chinese relations by President Nixon and Secretary of State Kissinger. This in protest against the opening up of a New York office by supporters of the Dalai Lama, exiled God-King of Tibet. It's also in protest against a planned U.S. tour - by a Tibetan song and dance company.*

*By permitting this says Peking - the U.S. is engaging in "undisguised interference in China's internal affairs;" "a flagrant violation" - of the Nineteen-Seventy-Two Shanghai Agreement. This on the eve of a visit by Secretary of State Kissinger - to complete arrangements for a suggested China visit by President Ford.*
