Good Evening Everybody:

Now let's consider the line that runs - from Aristarchus to Copernicus. Classical names - in the history of science. Aristarchus, the Ancient Greek who said - that the earth revolved in an orbit around the sun. **X** Copernicus, the sixteenth century polish theologian who proved it mathematically, and revolutionized astronomy.

When astronomers began to observe the face of the moon by means of a new invention, the telescope, they placed those two famous names on their maps of the lunar surface:- the crater - of Aristarchus. The crater of Copernicus.

And those names are in the news tonight because Ranger Seven landed at one corner of a triangle, with Aristarchus - to the North-East, and Copernicus - LEAD - 2

to the South-East. Actual point of impact - the Sea of Clouds. However, don't take that phrase "The Sea of Clouds" literally. The moon has - no water, consequently no seas - no clouds. The name dates back to the early days of astronomy - becore the total arididity of our natural satellite was discovered.

But what is the lunar surface - like? Our scientists will have a detailed knowledge of the terrain - when they piece together the photographs from Ranger Seven.

Meanwhile spare a thought for Aristarchus and Copernicus - for Galileo, Newton, Herschal and the rest, the geniuses who built the science of astronomy, and started mankind along the road to - today's remarkable feat. Closeup pictures of the moon.

RANGER SEVEN FOLLOW MOON

Ranger Seven landed only about ten miles from the Bull's eye. Incredible accuracy, when you consider that it had to hit a moving target almost a quarter of a million miles away. Nearly seventy hours to the rendezvous in space. "A text book operation" - according to professor William Pickering g Pasadena Flight Control Laboratory. As Dr. Lee Du Bridge, President of Caltech said to me today when he heard the news, "This is one of the number one thrills of our time."

The instruments functioned as perfectly -as the rockets. The cameras triggered into life about fifteen minutes before impact. Sending back some four thousand snapshots - to the tracking station in the Mojave Desert. "No interruption, no loss of power." say the scientists in charge.

The space "package" didn't go dead - until it reached its destination. Crashing into "the Sea

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of Clouds". By then Ranger Seven had become immortal in the history of science. By getting the closest view of the moon that any eye - human or mechanical has ever had.

SPACE FOLLOW RANGER

There are many reasons for celebrating this cosmic event. For one thing it's a triumphant success after a series of disappointments. Our space men have had to suffer - through Soviet successes and American failures. Especially galling because the Soviets have had spectacular failures of their own, which Moscow never mentions. No wonder our scientists are jubiland tonight.

Secondly this is a big step - toward putting a man on the moon. Our astronauts can't land without knowing the consistency of the lunar surface. (Is it sand and rock - like our desert? Or mountains of powdered dust? Or some kind of substance unknown on the earth? The science of lunar landings will depend on the answer to those questions.) We may be given the answer by Ranger Seven.

VICE PRESIDENT

The guessing about a Democratic Vice Presidential candidate is focused on the Gopher State and maybe the Empire State. But the two Senators from Minnesota are the prime favorites, now that President Johnson has ruled out the members of his official family. The President arguing - that his assistants are too valuable to shift from their present positions. Dean Rusk at the State Department, Robert McNamara at the Pentagon, Robert Kennedy at the Justice Department and so on.

Which brings us back to Minnesota, to Senators Humphrey and McCarthy. Humphrey is considered to be in a strong position because he helped maneuver the civil rights bill through congress. McCarthy is a well known Liberal and a Catholic - with a strong record as a campaigner. Their states would balance the ticket. Presidential candidate from Texas. Vice Presidential candidate from Minnesota -

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or could it be New York?

But nothing is certain - at this point. Not

with so many Democrats ready - willing and able to

take second place on the Democratic ticket.

BUTLER
