The two heads reportedly'smuggled out of the
country recently by anti-Communist Tibetans - outraged
at the Chinese infamy. A message sent along with the
heads -- asking the Dalai mama to put them on dapublic
display. Ad Adding that the Avloktesvara was but one of
a thousand images - destroyed by the Chinese.

A spokesman for the Dalai Lama calling the Chinese

Tasmania, off the southern tip of Axasor Australia. Bush fires
whipped by gale-force winds -- raging to within two miles
