WHITE HOUSE

The White House - an impromptu press conference - as no doubt you've heard by now. President Nixon covering a broad range of subjects - both foreign and domestic.

On Vietnam - the President observing that Saigon is far from achieving a U.S. - style democracy; turning
down flat, however, the notion that U.S. aid should be cut off
- simply because of Vietnam's one-man Presidential race.
"If we were to apply the standards that some propose" - said
the President - "we would have to cut off our aid to two-thirds
of the world."

On that still-pending draft bill - the President

charging that Senate failure to act - is undermining American

peace initiatives throughout the world. And the Senate 
should it finally reject the draft bill - would be committing

"one of the most irresponsible acts I can think of"-said the

President.

On Senator Muskie's recent statement - regarding the possibility of a black man running for Vice President -

the President saying it was a serious error. Adding: "It is very important for those of us in positions of political leadership - not to tell large numbers of young people that they cannot rise in our society - because of the accident of their birth."

On his upcoming visit to Red China - the President saying he expects a frank exchange of views; but it would be "naive" and "sentimental" - said he - to think that "if we just get to know each other - our difference will evaporate."

Adding in effect - no such tack.

A new insight into the tragedy at Attica - comes today from black leader David Anderson of Rochester, New York; one of those who served on a Citizens Committee - attempting to work out a compromise between inmates and prison officials. Anderson charging that talks with the convicts began to deteriorate - immediately after the arrival of "Chicago Seven" lawyer William Kunstler; who allegedly convinced the prisoners - that they should continue to hold out for full amnesty.

where the prisoners had seemed amenable to a settlement before - said Anderson - themood now changed; "they kept talking about the amnesty thing, they began talking about dying."

And he, himself eventually "lost faith"

- said Anderson; departing the prison after seventeen hours of talks - that finally led nowhere; except - to death.

At the peace table in Paris - the U.S. begins to get tough. With William Porter - in his second bargaining session - demanding a clarification of the Communists' latest seven-point peace proposal. Also, telling the Communist side "Let us have what you have to say - officially" instead of unofficially. This clearly a reference to a number of concessions the Communists' supposedly offered to make - in recent talks with Senator McGovern of South Dakota.

William Porter going on to say: "If you attempt to evade answering - by handing out more nonsense about how your seven points speak for themselves - you will further degrade your proposals - damage your credibility - and confirm that you are not seeking serious negotiations here." And then - if that wasn't enough - he added: "Let me assure you - you will get nowhere unless you dater your tactics."

(A later development: The Communist side announcing that) Madame Nguyen Thi Binh - the Viet Cong's chief negotiator - is being recalled to Vietnam for consultations. Whereupon observers quickly noting that the last time Madame Binh went home - she soon returned with a new peace proposal. Let's hope it happens again.

Here at home - at Fort McPherson, Georgia - Captain

Harold Medina was testifying today in his own behalf. Telling

a court-martial jury he specifically ordered his troops prior

to My Lai - not to kill women and children, if at all possible.

Medina adding that he also told his men - to "use common sense; if an individual is trying to host you - then shoot; if he is running away - I fire a warning shot; and if he doesn't stop - then shoot to wound or kill."

overseas again - London - the final session of that

two-day Group of Ten meeting; ending with ajoint communique

from the ten richest nations in the free world; a document

asserting that "substantial adjustment - is required" of one

and all; adding that "the measures necessary to bring about

this adjustment - should be taken on a wide front - and

should include an appropriate realignment of currencies;"

therefore, authorizing the creation of a joint study group 
to explore "ways and means of reforming international

monetary arrangments."

The Group of Ten also scheduling another meeting for a week from Saturday in Washington; by which time,
it is hoped - they can all agree on a more definitive course
of action.

For more than twenty years now - the Red Chinese have held full sway in Tibet sealing it off from the outside worlds - as the by a Bamboo Curtain.

But this next - well, would you call it "hands across the Himalayas?" At any rate, the Red Chinese presently running Tibet - agreeing today to make a trade with neighboring Nepal; ten thousand Tibetan sheep and goats - in return for three thousand pounds of the chile peppers and wheat flour. Said exchange to take place - at the Chinese-built Friendship Bridge on the Kathmandu-Kodari highway; starting now - and continuing over the next three days.

All this - at the instigation of the Nepalese; who need the sheep and goats for sacrificial offerings & at two religious holidays coming up shortly. The first called Vijayadashmi - "The Festival of the Triumph of Truth over Evil;" and the second - Divali - "The Festival of Lights."

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Britain's Prince Philip - a visitor today to Budapest,

Hungary; there watching an "International Coach Driving

Contest" - being held in conjunction with a world hunting

exhibition.

But more than that - Prince Philip also breaking a silent boycott of more than fifty years. Becoming the first member of the British royal family to visit a Soviet block country - since Nineteen-Eighteen, when Czar Nicholas and his British-born Alexandra - were slain by the Bolsheviks.
