My companions were stalwart mountaineers of Utah, and they pitched in. So did I, shoveling more snow than the handled in a score of years. We made it by an eye-lash, while a herd of a hundred or more elk, and several hundred deer looked on, probably laughing at us, as we got out of Cottonwood Canyon.
