All-important among people who have lived for centuries with the avalanche hazard hanging over them like the sword of Damacles. Andre Koch has come over as a guest of the National Ski Patrol, through C. Minot Dole, head of that organization, and is making studies in the colorado Kockies, the Sierras, the fabulous Mineral $k i n g$ country, and here in the Wasatch Mountains.

Curb, were in the wasatch, they have made the only comprehensive body of avalanche meocrds in this country -- compiled by the supervisor of the Wasatch Mational Forest, K. C. found that another avalanche had come down and trapped us, a minor slide. It was interesting to watch expert Kozodil go into action. First he looked the situation over to make sure a second avelemetre would not come down on top of the first tone. Then he got out two shovels that he always carried. Several other cars were behind us, and avalanche expert Kozdil put us all to work shoveling that heavy compressed snow which buried about thirty yards of the road. It was our only chance to get out to salt Lake city so that i could get through to the studio at K.S.L.

My companions were stalwart mountaineers of Utah, and they pitched in. so did $I$, shoveling more snow than +'vie handled in a score of years. We made it by an eyelash, while a herd of a hundred or more elk, and several hundred deer looked on, probably laughing at us, as wet out of Cottonwood Canyon.
