From Oregon, Idaho and California - good news.

Those torrential rains of the last three days - finally

over. With a cold wave - sweeping down from the North,

refreezing the melting snowpack at higher elevations
the melted snow responsible for much of the flooding.

As for the devastation left by the flood waters it was a real disaster, says Oregon's Governor Mark Hatfield.
With more than twenty dead and seven thousand homeless.
Twenty five bridges down in Oregon alone - Many major
highways still blocked. Many people still cut off from
help - Property damage - more than two hundred million
dollars.

Here's a reverse side of the coin. With the waters of Lake Erie - now at an all-time low, the New York

Central Railroad tonight reports a new rain-making technique

- that could fill it to overflowing - so they say.

The weather-mechanism explained by officials of the railroad's Cleveland Technical Center. Artificial water to be triggered by high tension power lines. The power lines emitting positive ions into the air - to cause rain. Or, conversely, sending out negatively-charged currents - to prevent rain.

Sound a bit far out? Not at all - claims the railroad. Heavy industry in Buffalo, New York, and La Porte, Indiana - said to be creating their own artificial weather right now.

UNITED NATIONS

In the United Nations today - renewed red-hot debate on the Congo question. Soviet Ambassador Morozov again calling the U.S. and Belgian airlift to Stanleyville - an act of "armed aggresision". Morozov claiming the rescue of some two thousand hostages was unwarrented and unnecessary Comparable to Nazi aggression - under Adolph Hitler, said he.

U.S. Ambassador Adlai Stevenson responding - with a blistering, point-by-point denial of the communist charges. Stevenson attacking what he called the double standard - of the communist bloc. Admitting on one hand - that they help the Congolese rebels, but denying the right of other states to answer the Congo call for help.

However, Stevenson singled out the African nations themselves - for his most stinging rebuke. Centering his counter attack on African claims that the U.S. had set up a trap in Stanleyville - and baited it with innocent human beings that, said S evenson, was perhaps the most outrageous - the most desp.cable charge of all.

The thirty-one year old Handy thus forced to return to song writing - and barely able to support his wife and children.

From this dismal setting - in Christmas week

of eighteen sixty four - Handy composes a rollicking

Santa Claus song, sung publicly for the first time on Christmas

day - by a children's choir in Richmond, Indiana. The rest

is fold song history.

And so tonight - in Handy's home town of New Paris, Ohio - that's just a few miles from my own birth place in near Greenville, Ohio - they are celebrating the one hundredth anniversary of that immortal Christmas song.

A joyful tune - that will be heard tonight throughout the world up on the house top, Click! Clik! Click! Down through the chimney - with good St. Nick and a Ho, Ho, Ho to you, Dick.
