This - says whitehead - an attempt to put

Whitehead further noting - there are now "only a few sources of national news on TV."

Adding: "Just as a newspaper publisher has responsibility for the wire service copy that appears
in this newspaper - so television station owners and managers must have full responsibility for what goes out over the airwaves - no matter what the origin of the program."
