Defense Secretary Laird - testifiying before the Senate Appropriatons Committee, today predicted an over-all cut in U.S. defense spending as a result of the new Salt Pact with the Soviet Union:

However he stressed that Russia has "far outstripped" the U.S. - in actual production of all manners of weapons - "both offensive and defense." He urges crash programs to develop "new weapons programs," just in case; including the Trident missile firing submarine - also, the supersonic B-1 Bomber.

Discussing possible cut back in defense spending - as proposed by George McGovern, Secretary Laird saying: "The result would be surrender." The Defense Secretary adding that, indeed, "congress would then have to spend a billion on white flags - so we could run them up all over the world."

When John Connolly resigned last month as Secretary of the Treasury - he said it was time for a respite from public service; time to devote more attention - to his own personal affairs. But successor, still to be access confirmed; and already the former Texas Governor is undertaking a new assignment by appointment today from the Florida white house; becoming President Nixon's personal emissary around the globe. Press Secretary Ron Ziegler spelling out the details saying Connolly will leave next week for trip that will take him to South America first, - and then the Far East, Southeast Asia and Europe. This - we are told "a further effort on the part of the President to continue communications with other governments" the world over. Ziegler stressing that Connolly will be ready and able - "to talk about any subject that foreign leaders would like to raise." Adding that

he - Connolly - will have some points to raise also.

All of which is almost certain to set off another round of speculation - about Connolly's role in the coming campaign. Although as of now - he remains a Democrat.
