In the nation's capitol - the twenty-first annual
national prayer breakfast; with President Nixon recalling
some sage words of advice - from his Quaker grandmother -
who told him: "What thee must understand, Richard, is that
the purpose of prayer - is to listen to God - not to talk
to God; the purpose of prayer is not to tell God what thee
wants - but to find out from God what he wants of thee."

The President adding on his own: "What this nation
needs to do now is to pray in silence - and listen to God -
and find out what he wants for us - and then well all do the right thing."

The President was accompanied to today's affair by First Lady Pat Nixon and Tricia and Edward Cox. The President's daughter and son-in-law later attending a pro-Nixon rally across from the White House. Ed Cox telling some fifteen hundred young people the President was being "persecuted by charges in the press which would prove to be untrue." Adding that "John Dean was a coward" whose "whole object was to get immunity."

The couple also denounced recent rumors - that their marriage was breaking up. Tricia saying: "I don't know how they got started - we really love each other."

Incidentally the latest Harris poll released today

- suggests the tide may have begun to turn. At any rate the majority of Americans are said to agree - the President "is trying to do his best in an almost impossible job." And an even greater majority are said to feel he is "experienced and smart - especially in foreign affairs - with still more saying - "he is not afraid to take decisive action as in his handling of the Middle East war."

The Poll is also said to show overwhelming
agreement - that "if the takes show the President was not involved in the Watergate then the country should get behind him in a show of national unity."

As for reaction the President's state of the Union message - about what you might expect. Republicans applauding the President's call - for "a year of outstanding progress. " Some Demicicats - not all by any means saying it was filled with "generalities and platitudes."

The House Judiciary Committee was also splitting along party lines today; rejecting, by a vote of twenty-three to fourteen - a move to impose an April deadline on its pending impeachment inquiry. Along the way, Congressman Brooks of Texas - urging his fellow Democrats to utilize their "unqualified power." Brooks saying: "We have full subpoena power, by God - let's exercise it."

A threatened nationwide trucker tie-up
apparently went into effect today only in Pennsylvania and Ohio, with a series of violent incidents leading to the death of at least one driver.

The bodies of three persons apparently hacked to death were found today in the chapel of an Oakland mortuary. Police theorizing they may have been killed by a man who calls himself Zodiac. Zodiac previously claiming this thirty-seven victims - since nineteen sixty-six. This - coupled with seventeen unsolved murders in San Francisco sending a chill throughout the Bay area.
