The talks - on ~~possible~~ possible changes affecting the four thousand mile ~~of~~ Sino-Soviet border - began nearly two years ago and ^{we are told} have gotten nowhere.

VISITS

ADD INDO CHINA

In Saigon, the U S command ~~began~~^{is} ~~a~~ planning
to withdraw forty-two thousand American troops
from Vietnam during the next three months. This
~~would~~^{will} cut U S troop strength ~~there~~ to one hundred
eighty-four thousand by December first.

The government says eight more Metropolitan areas now have "substantial unemployment ~~rates~~ rates of six percent or more -- bringing to sixty-two the total number of major cities in this category, the highest in nine years. Among the new cities on the list are Boston and Philadelphia, ^{also} Fort Worth Texas - and Charleston, South Carolina, where cut backs in defense industries are factors in the jobless rate.

In Washington, White House economic advisor Paul McCracken predicts ~~that~~ President Nixon's program for additional business next year ^{will} create ~~two~~ five hundred thousand new jobs. However, he warns of new inflation unless further ~~restrictions~~ restraints are imposed after the current ninety day wage-price freeze is over.

DRIVING

Government safety experts claim that - by far -- the most dangerous threat facing America's ~~you~~ young people today is a relatively simple one -- easy to explain. It's the mere act of riding in an automobile with other young people. Drivers in the age range ~~of~~ fifteen to twenty five ~~are~~ are being killed at a rate far out of proportion to their share of the driving population. We're told also - the highway death rate for young people has been constantly rising for seventeen years. The reason? - Increase in affluence which permits many youngsters to own an auto and get a driver's license -- also, the growing ~~use~~ use of drugs and alcohol - and possibly, a lesser respect for law and order. To check the trend, government safety experts recommend two year probationary licenses for drivers under twenty-one.

Dr. Blair MacAuley of London says there's no cure in sight for your allergy -- whatever it might be - even though there ^{is} relief for those who follow general guidelines.
