President Nixon will deliver a nationwide radio address ~~over radio~~ on Labor Day - this coming Monday. ~~Details of the speech~~ are ~~not~~ given - ^{Altho' no details} ~~but he's~~ ^{he is} expected to ask Labor Leaders to cooperate with his new economic policy - and appeal for "temporary sacrifices" by ^{all} Americans in the fight against inflation.

In Washington a federal judge set the stage for what ~~may become~~ may become an early Supreme Court test of the President's wage price control. Judge Aubrey Robins Junior in a case involving salary increases - ruled that the freeze poses constitutional issues that may require broader court hearings.

The Labor Department -- in its monthly report - says wholesale prices scored ^{some} ~~big~~ gains -- ^{three tenths of one percent} during August - ~~emphasizing even more~~ ^{reflecting} the inflated

ARAB FEDERATION

Voters in ~~three Arab nations~~ - Libya, Egypt and Syria - have overwhelmingly approved formation of a federation representing almost half the so-called Arab world's population of one hundred million. There is a possibility the Sudan may also join. This federation is termed by some - "the Arab answer to Israeli aggression."

Israeli troops and Palestinian guerrillas today were at it again along the Levanesse border - with both sides blaming the other for starting the shooting.

BIG FOUR

The Big Four - Russia, Britain, France and the United States - failed to sign that new agreement regarding Berlin today, as scheduled. This because of a dispute over the German translation of the text. Spokesmen in Berlin say it may be signed tomorrow.

IRELAND

Bombs exploded in rapid succession in several parts of Belfast, ~~northern Ireland~~, during the lunch hour today - sending men, women and children into the streets - screaming and crying for help for the wounded. Ambulances - ~~their~~ sirens wailing - ~~had~~ rushed through the streets - to pick up more than thirty-five, ^{some of them} ~~persons -- at least~~ ~~are~~ injured seriously. The British army blames the outlawed I R A for the explosions which shattered the Unionist party headquarters -- damaged a communities relations building - and the Bedford House art gallery.

In New York, immigration officials are holding in voluntary custody the most wanted man in northern Ireland - Joe Cahill - the I R A leader who ^{arrived} ~~came~~ ~~to the United States with the ~~un~~ avowed purpose~~ here to ^{of} ~~some~~ raising funds to buy arms ^{to} ~~for~~ a fight ~~against~~ the British.

HANOI

North Vietnamese premier Pham Van Dong went on the Hanoi Radio today - urging help in restoring transportation during one of the worst floods in the country's history. Flood waters from the Red River - running waist deep through parts of Hanoi endangering the dyke system that protects the rice lands - crippling the rail and road system that carries military supplies to the south.

INSTITUTE

In its annual report, issued ⁱⁿ ~~to~~ London, the international institute for strategic studies says Russia has succeeded in tripling its polaris type missile force -- and ^{has set} ~~setting~~ up nearly three hundred new inter-continental rockets. This - says the report - has been accomplished since Russia and the United States began the so-called Salt Talks on curbing strategic nuclear weapons two years ago. ^R The institute, ~~is~~ a British based research center on ~~international~~ defense and world security, - ~~is~~ ^{is} describing itself as "independent of any government," ~~and~~ drawing its staff from fifteen different nations. Among other assertions made by the study are these: ~~that~~ Russia now has fifteen ~~hundred~~ hundred intercontinental ballistic missiles -- about five hundred more than the U S.

The military balance between Nato and the

Communist countries ~~now~~ in Europe has moved further in favor of the Communist bloc ~~=~~ represented by the Warsaw pact. Nato has fewer tanks and planes - but has seven thousand nuclear warheads compared with three ~~has~~ thousand five hundred in the Communist arsenal.
