
The ninth anniversary of the Korean armistice was observed today - with the guns silent, but the war of words continuing.

South Korea's government newspaper said: "The armistice was a mistake," and it called for increased vigilance against the communists.

~~The North Korean radio denounced both the government at Seoul and the United States, saying they "have not lived up to the peace agreement."~~

Although most people have forgotten it, the military armistice commission which the U.N. and the communists created nine years ago, still meets at the tiny truce village of Panmunjom. - The purpose? To achieve a political settlement and a unified Korea.

A major settlement is announced by the Justice Department. General Electric Company has agreed to pay the government seven and one-half million dollars - the largest amount in anti-trust history, to settle damage suits arising from the recent price-fixing cases.
