LATTIMORE

Startling, contradiction today in Washington, in the Owen Lattimore affair. A famous ex-Communist branded him a Red. A former chief of our Army Counterinterligence said he is not a Communist. There was another one of those strangly dramatic scenes. In the senate committee room sat Lattimore, middle-aged, dignified -- like the personification of high respect and high regard. Owen Lattimore -- noted as an authority on the Far East, author of books and one-time advisor to the State Department. Not far from him Louis Budenz, one-time Communist and Managing Editor of the chief Red newspaper in this country, New York's "Daily Worker". Budenz, a small slight figure, with sharp features, who looks the part of what he was for long -- a radical labor agitator. But he turned against Communism, rejoined the Catholic Church, to which he was born -- now a professor of Economics for the University.

Louis Budenz declared that he knew of Owen

Lattimore as a Communist, because of what he was told

by the top leaders of the American Red party; Farl

Browder -- who was then chief of the American Communists

acquainted with Lattimore -- all his information

coming through proceedings in that American

Politburo.
