Tonight the historic Latin Quarter of Paris

- is under a state of siege. Traffic - at a standstill
along the Left Bank. Barricades - are up in the streets. Gu d Three thousand tough pecked gendarmes Three thousand tough $A$ are standing guard - questioning everyone moving in or out.

The reason - today's violent street fight between opposing factions. One side, calling for - an immediate truce in Algeria. The other side, shouting - "Algeria is French!"

The violence erupted at a hall - where four thousand students were listening to a speech in favor of a quick peace. Right wing demonstrators began to mill around - the building; Then they threw bombs through the windows.

The result - chaos; The audience fought to get to
the Re exits - and stumbled out, coughing and rubbing their eyes. In a moment, a wild melee - as fist fights broke
out all over the Latin Quarter. Innocent bystanders were caught - between the factions. The security police couldn't restore order - until they formed a wergem wedge and charged through the streets swinging their batons. There were so many injured - an impromptu first aid station had to be set up in a barber shop, and many were rushed of to eases $=$ hospital ${ }^{5}$. Mere than a hundred $\begin{aligned} & \text { were } \\ & \pi\end{aligned}$ arrested.

France, moving into another crisis - over Aqeria.

Events in Cuba - are confused tonight. No one seems to know what Castro is up to - putting his island on a virtual war footing; post army detachments right
at strong points across Cuba; bringing his militia into Havana - and asking more workers to join up; and warning all Cubans - to be prepared for an invasion. Tonight Havana is seething with rumors - about an - approaching from where. approaching armada, Why doesh't Castro stop the rumors which he must know are false? One guess is that he wants - whoever they are -
to trick his opponents $\lambda^{\text {into emerging - so that he can }}$ seize them.
whose Congolese army has been teri terrorizing Leopoldville. U diplomat Rajeshwar Dayal of India - ordered him to remove them; And today Mobutu obeyed - sending his men back to their barracks. Leaving the UN forces - to patrol Leopoldville.

The U N defeat - came in secessionist Katanga Province, w her Premier Tshombe, reject ed a note - from Dag Hammarskjold. The note accuses Tshombe of trying to break up the Congo - and asks him to get rid of his Belgian advisors. To which Tshombe replies that Katanga is already independent - and resents $U N$ interference in its internal ada affairs.

The identical notes delivered in Moscow by the three western allies - are a strong warning to the Kremlin. Britain, France, and the United States - telling Khrushchev not to interfere with our access to Berlin. The main point at issue - the air corridor, across East Germany. The East German Reds are threatening to harass - allied aircraft. Hence the warning to Khrushchev - to bring his puppets to heel.

Observers in West Berlin believe Khrushchev won't go too far, just now. But they add - he probably wants to kan: keep up anxiety in the West, Prepare the ground - for a Berlin crisis early next year. The crisis he might provoke

- in his bid to force the next American President to meet him at the Summit.

President Eisenhower mingled sentiment with politics - during today's visit to Staunton, Virginia, The sentiment - a visit to his mother's birthplace. And the birthplace - of "woodrow Wilson. Although billed as "non-political" his speech included a denunciation of "false leaders"; and a defense of "safe leaders". No one in the Staunton audience missed the President's implication.

Vice President Nixon was in Jackson, Michigan, today. The city that claims to be - the birthplace of the Republican party. But the Republican and date wasn't talking - history, he xe was aline - pleas. The $15=0$ - money, ${ }^{\prime}$

Hixorng accused Kennedy of not understanding economics - especially the need for a sound dollar. At this point, the Vice President brought up - personal finances. Comparing his own background - with that of his opponent. Pointing out that he himself knows what it means

- to budget carefully according to a low income. While of vast wealth Kennedy, from a family - has never had to bother with such problems.

Nixon argued today that this difference in
experience should be a factor - in deciding which candidate is better fitted to handle the national budget.

Ce far Senator Kennedy's rally in New York's garment Todaint was one of Same district, $A$ the biggest taxi of his campaign. Three hundred and fifty thousand New Yorkers turned out - to cheer and applaud. During his address, Kennedy stressed his "new frontier" theme. Accusing Nixon of looking to the past Kennedy promised to lead American forward into the future. Said he - "Nixon doesn't understand the times in which we live."
