An agreement has been reached on the British loan - announced in Washington late this afternoon. The United States agrees to modify the terms of the agreement under wich we lent to the British Government three-billion-seven-hundred-million dollars.

the "convertibility clause" throus a provision, under which the British agreed to pay dollars, instead of pounds sterling, to any nation that demanded such payment. In other words, if Britain bought goods from Canada or Argentina, for example, and those countries wanted dollars in payment, instead of pounds sterling, Britain was required to pay with a with dollars. That now is suspended, as an emergency measure - Britain required to pay dollars only to the United States, not to other countries.

And this marcoursen will help to ease the heavy drain on the British supply of dollars - the drain that has been causing the British to use up so much of the loan so fast.

At the Inter-American conference in Rio,
our secretary of State told the Delegates of the Americas
today that the emergency in Europe is the vital thing. The
needs of Europe are more pressing than those of the
Republics of the Western Hemisphere hence, aid to Europe
takes precedence. There have been Latin-American demands
for an economic agreement, but Secretary of State Marshall
is pressing for simply an inter-American defense agreement
- holding that, on the economic side, the critical point
is Europe.

In Korea, the American Commander has been portesting vainly because the Soviets are holding three G.I.'s as xxx prisoners - keeping them incommunicado, no American allowed to go near them. Lieutenant General Hodge has addressed repeated protests to the Soviet Military Forces, demanding the release of the three American But they haven't even given to soldiers, but has not every of a reply. Morrell was that he was afraid to fly, was reluctant to accompany Hitler on airplane trips. Der Fuehrer wanted a doctor all the time, and there was an opening. So, at Berchtesgaden, the champion woman swimmer suggested the her husband, Dr. Brandt, and he was taken on as the Dictator's personal physician - the Charlatan Morrell keeping his place of influence behind the scenes.

Thus it was that Dr. Brandt got into the whirl of affairs that now takes him to the gallows. As Hitler's personal physician he was all-pawker powerful in medical circles the medical dictator of Germany. What led him into the maze of Mazi crime? Mathat persuaded the sound and competent scientist to become the director of the wholesale horror of the human guinea pig experiments in the concentration camps? R We are further told that the Treasury has a cash balance of seven hundred and forty-seven million - and that will be applied to the debt. In other words, we are, in this fiscal year, trimming nearly five and a half billion dollars from the giant public debt of two-hundred-and-fifty-nine-billion, eight-hundred-and eighty-nine million, a hundred-and-ten thousand, sixty-two dollars and fifty-one cents. the Balkans to the Ceneral Assembly of the United Nations.

This was announced formally today. Yesterday, at the Security Council, the Soviets cast two vetoes, killing all possibility of action to check Communist aggression by the Red Puppets against Greece. So, promptly, we are appealing from the Security Council to the General Assembly, which meets in September. — the full gathering of the United Nations to consider the Red Threat to peace in the Balkans.

News about the revolution in Paraguay is a tangle of confusion. A few days ago the insurgents appeared about to win out - with the seizure of the capital city of Asuncion. But today the leader of the insurrection, Colonel Franco, appeared on the Argentine Border and asked to be admitted and given asylum in Argentina .- There is a report that the whole rebel General Staff has arrived, following the insurgent Commander in his flight. The sudden shift of the revolution in Paraguay is complicated by the confusion of rumors: but the rapid change of events appears to have gone sometning like this: First, the government troops of President Mark Morinigo staged a swift advance and captured the capital of the rebels - and the government announced victory, the imminent suppression of the revolt. But the insurgents, with the capute of their capital, made a sudden swing to the south, and struck at the government capital - Asuncion. They announced they were about to capture the place, for a triumph of the revolution. However

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the catch was right ther at Asuncion. The insurrectos were able to surround the city, assail it from all sides but were unable to caput Asuncion. There was a ten day siege, which failed - the pendulum of victory swung to the side of the Government. At least, hat would seem to be the state of affairs tonight, with rebel commander Colonel Franco sesking seeking refuge in Argentina - his General Staff doing the same, apparently. However, rebel spokesmen in Brazil insist that the revolt is by no means over - and that the pendulum is about to swing back the other way.
