Israel charges - the Syrians murdered the wife of the British Air Attache to Israel. Mrs. Mary Joyce Doran - whose body was found, early today, near the Syrian border.

The evidence shows - that Mrs. Doran was vacationing at a rest home operated by Italian nuns in northern Israel.

Near the rest home are ancient ruins, north of Capernaum, the decided town so well known in the Gospels. The wife of the British Air Attache went out for a sightseeing walk to the run ruins.

When - she was shot down by machine-gun fire.

The Israelis declare - three cartridge cases, with Syrian marking, were found near the body. Together with footprints - of two barefoot men. The tracks - leading across the Syrian border.

Israel, today, made a strong protest, complaining to the United Nations.

CYPRUS

The British on Cyprus report - they trapped and killed the number two leader of the anti-British underground.

The latest in a new drive against terrorists.

The Chief of the underground - Colonel George Grivas,
whom the British have been trying to catch for years - in vain.
Second only to Grivas - Kyriakos Matsis, chief of insurgents
in ** northern ** Cyprus.

Today's dispatch relates how the British got a tip that the hideaway of Matsis was in a bungalow outside a

Cypriot village. Soldiers raided the place. They searched
the bungalow - and discovered a slab of concrete under a

bedroom floor. They pried open the concrete, and under it the hideout.

Whereupon they shouted down into the subterranean cell - a call to surrender. Two men came up, members of the underground. Neither of them - the much hunted Matsis.

The British shouted again into the hideaway. Calling "Is Matsis in there?" Silence, no reply. Whereupon they

threw two handgrenades into the hideaway. Two violent explosions. A search then revealing - that Matsis was there.

Killed - in possession of a machine gun and boxes of ammunition.

BAGHDAD

More savage sentences - imposed by a military court at wag Baghdad. On statesmen of the former regime - who are accused of helping bring Iraq into the pro-Western Baghdad Pact. Today, former Premier Ahmed Mukhtar Babab - sentenced to hang.

GENEVA

From both Geneva conferences - same kind of news, this evening. In each one - the Soviets rejecting Western proposals.

The Moscow delegate gave a turn-down to a Western plan, for combining - talks on a ban with a discussion of controls to police a prohibition of atomic tests.

At the other Geneva conference, the one on the prevention of surprise attacks - the Western powers presented technical data, which the Kussian delegation - brushed aside, arguing - they'll only talk about a general agreement on disarmament.

Two Geneva conferences again deadlocked.

BERLIN

The State Department in Washington - in a sharp reply
to Soviet accusations. The Reds - having accused this country
of using West Berlin as a base for espionage. The East German
Communists - their two worth. Declaring the
Western powers have been winited violating the agreement
granting them access to West Berlin.

The American retort is - Soviet Russia is guilty of "massive interference in German affairs," By maintaining a puppet East German regime - with the use of military force.

Same old exchange of compliments between East and West, along the old line of - you're another

NCELROY

Secretary of Defense Neil McElroy, today, directed the armed forces - to cut their total manpower by more than seventy-one thousand. The reductions to be made - by next June Thirtieth.

At the same time, Secretary McElroy slashed the number of men drafted by the Army in January. Two thousand fewer - than in previous months. The January draft call to be - nine thousand.

The Virginia school segregation law - attacked in a federal court at Norfolk. Fifteen white parents - suing Governor Lindsay Almond. Calling on him - to reopen six high schools, closed in Norfolk. Their attorney describing the Virginia resistance to racial integration - as a massive lockout of children.

School Board Chairman John Brewbaker testified that the closing of schools in Norfolk has "demoralized" the
