~~in baseball~~ - Jim Maloney of the Cincinnati

Reds - today pitched the first no-hitter of the Nineteen
Sixty-Five season. A ten-inning one to nothing victory over
the Chicago Cubs - at Wrigley Field. Leo Cardenas
wrapping up the win - with a homer in the first extra
inning of play.

The feat, ironically, marking the second time
this year - that Maloney has pitched ten straight innings
of no-hit ball. He did it against the Mets on June
fourteenth - but lost the game - one-to-nothing - when
he himself gave up a homer in the eleventh.

CAPE

A long wait for nothing -- today at Cape Kennedy -- as you have no doubt heard by now. A freak combination of natural and man-made obstacles -- finally forcing the first cancellation of a manned Gemini space flight.

Lift-off for the epic eight-day voyage of the Gemini-Five -- now put off until Saturday, at the earliest.

AID

In Washington - the House today began a speed-up toward adjournment, ~~Enroute~~ - approving at last a one-year extension - on that controversial foreign Aid Bill.

At a cost - of about three ~~point three~~ ^{and a third} billion dollars.

Similar Senate approval - expected Monday.

The House Appropriations Committee - meanwhile approving a down payment of one ~~point two~~ ^{and a quarter} billion dollars,

~~For use in the new school aid program,~~ ^{also} in the new administration on aging, - and, for stepped-up research into heart disease, cancer and stroke.

OKINAWA

A non-welcoming crowd of some four thousand leftists - on hand at Naha, Okinawa, today. For a howling reception - to Japanese Premier Sato. On his arrival for a three-day visit to the Japanese island -- occupied by U. S. forces for the last twenty years.

The demonstrators blocking Sato's motorcade - at the U S High Commissioner's office. Clashing twice with some ~~ss~~ seven hundred police - before they were finally dispersed. But later returning - and forcing Sato to leave his hotel - for the security of a nearby military barracks.

The leftists opposed to Sato's visit - on the grounds that it signifies government approval of the presence of U S troops in Okinawa, ~~Last~~ stop - on the air route to Viet Nam.

JEWS FOLLOW OKINAWA

A similar but smaller reception - today in Jerusalem. ^{Some fifteen} ~~Hundreds of~~ Israeli Jews - many of them survivors of Nazi death camps - clashing with club-swinging police, ~~In~~ a protest against the arrival of Rolf Pauls - the first West German Ambassador to Israel.

The angry crowd shouting "Pauls Raus" - Pauls get out. Charging to within sixty feet of the Presidential Palace - where Pauls was presenting his credentials - before they were stopped by police. Just short of an Israeli honor guard of fifty ~~thick~~ tough tank corpsmen. With submachine guns - cradled in their arms.

The ~~pk~~ police action - greeted with cries of "Shame" from the demonstrators. Although later credited - with averting a potential tragedy.

NAZIS FOLLOW JEWS

Meanwhile, in Frankfurt - sixteen ex-Nazis
and one turncoat Jew - were found ~~xxx~~ guilty of complicity
today, ~~In~~ the mass murder of from two-to-four million
inmates - of the notorious Auschwitz concentration camp.

Six of Hitler's helpers in the greatest death
house ~~xxx~~ in all history - sentenced to life imprisonment
at hard labor. ~~The~~ The maximum sentence - in West Germany.
The other eleven drawing prison terms - that range from
thirty-nine months to fourteen years.

Three co-defendants acquitted, however - in
Germany's biggest and longest war crimes trial to date.

GENEVA

At Geneva - the Soviet Union today rejected as a waste of time -- that U S draft treaty for halting the spread of nuclear weapons. Soviet delegate Tsaraphin - refusing even to discuss the proposal.

Britain's Lord Chalfont adding for his part - that the world may already have passed the point - where smaller nations can be prevented from getting nuclear weapons. After which - they all adjourned to Italy for the weekend.

VIET NAM

U S Marines in Viet Nam - tonight mopping up the remainder of that two-thousand man guerrilla force - they met and conquered yesterday near Chu Lai. The Leathernecks using rifles, grenades and flame-throwing tanks to wipe out the few remaining pockets of enemy resistance.

The two-day operation - called the Marines' toughest combat assignment since the Korean war. Comparable to the battle of ~~Sun~~ Sawtooth Ridge on Okinawa - in Nineteen Forty-Five. But more important - the biggest U S victory to date - in the war in Viet Nam.

The Marines said to have killed - ^{some} ~~at least~~ six hundred of the trapped Viet Cong. With the number of Communist wounded - estimated at more than a thousand.

COMMENT

An editorial ~~that~~ appeared today in the London Daily ~~Ex~~ Telegraph - ^{that may be} ~~perhaps~~ well worth repeating here in the United States. A comment - on the recent trans-Atlantic voyage of Robert Manry, ~~who sailed~~ ^{who} sailed ~~at~~ solo from Falmouth, Massachusetts, to Falmouth, England - in a thirteen and a half foot boat.

The voyage - in a sense - "useless" said the Telegraph. Because "it has been done before - and it will be done again by voyagers who prove nothing but their own mettle - and discover nothing save their own inner resources. ^{continues the London editorial,} Yet ^{these} these adventurers allow the rest of us to discover something in ourselves: A perennial admiration for the single-handed feat - that seems to grow stronger as other human activities become more complex and organized."

"If our attention is focused more on Manry than on the American astronauts," ^{the} the article continued - "it

is not because the hazards he faced are greater - ~~an~~ or

Robert Manry - "the supreme individualist" -
said the Telegraph. "Whom we should all like to be - if
we could."

Sultan Ismail described as a mild-mannered Prince, ~~Who~~ - at fifty-eight - prefers photography to pomp and circumstance. And just as well. Because the role of King in Malaysia - is little more than that of a puppet to Parliament.

Nevertheless, a great honor - for Prince Ismail. ~~Who~~ will be sworn into office next month, his term as King to last for the next five years.
