McNAMARA

To blast military targets -- ^{this time} only about thirty miles from Red China. While to the South -- American and Vietnamese bombers saturated a two-square-mile area of jungle near Da Nang. Believed to be the hideout -- of a regional Communist command post.

STEVENS ON

The nation and the world was shocked and saddened today -- by the sudden and unexpected death of Adlai Stevenson.

Adlai Stevenson -- that rare breed of man, ~~A~~ rejected leader -- who continued to lead. Twice denied the ultimate honor of American politics -- only to rebound as the dominant figure of world diplomacy. Through his post at the United Nations -- the one man who truly represented to millions overseas -- the American quest for peace, freedom and the dignity of man.

Stevenson apparently the victim -- of a heart attack. He collapsed while on a visit to London -- shortly after conferring with British officials. Dead in a matter of seconds -- at the age of sixty-five.

President Johnson calling on the nation -- "to weep for one who was a friend -- who was a guide to all mankind." While additional tributes to the fallen statesman -- pour in from throughout the world.

Perhaps none more fitting than that inscribed in a

special
~~condolence~~ book -- opened ^{*this afternoon*} in the U.S. Mission to the United

Nations. The first entry reading: "Nineteen Sixty-Five --

the year the world lost ^{*Sir*} Winston Churchill -- and -- Adlai

Stevenson."

SHEPPARD

Dr. Sam Sheppard today lost another round -- in his marathon battle for freedom. A Cincinnati appeals court once again rejecting his claim -- that he failed to receive a fair trial.

The Cleveland osteopath -- ordered back to ^{prison,} ~~jaill~~
To resume a life sentence -- in the bludgeon-slaying of his pregnant wife Marilyn.

Pending an appeal -- to the Supreme Court.

TIBET

From New Delhi -- a report today that some
twenty-five thousand Khampa tribesmen of Tibet -- are in open
rebellion against the Chinese Communists, ^{— the red} Invaders who seized
control of that lost world -- in Nineteen Sixty.

The tribesmen ^{are} said to be marching -- enmasse -- on
the capital of Lhasa. Ancient home of the Dalai Lama -- who was
forced to flee to New Delhi -- before the Communist onslaught.

Lhasa radio admitting that the Chinese have begun to
deploy troops -- in an effort to crush the rebellion. ~~But as~~

KOREA

A wild twenty-minute free-for-all tonight -- in the Korean National Assembly, precipitated by an attempt on the part of the government party -- to force early consideration of that new friendship treaty -- between South Korea and Japan.

Unable to prevent the speed-up by normal parliamentary means -- opposition legislators stormed the dais in an attempt to seize the speaker's ^{platform.} ~~chair~~ Chairs, and ^{too,} heads were smashed in the ensuing struggle -- ^{until} ~~as~~ government legislators beat back the assault.

HOOVER

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover today warned the Communist diplomats in the United States -- are a dangerous threat to national security. There are eight hundred such diplomats in all -- said he many of whom are engaged in Intelligence activities -- while "protected by the privilege of diplomatic immunity."

J. Edgar Hoover adding that the Communists had clearly played a key role -- in a number of recent student demonstrations across the country; demonstrations against U.S. policies -- in South Viet Nam and the Dominican Republic. Also -- in the field of Civil Rights.
