Washington adding that our only communication **quith** with the Viet Cong till now - has been concerned solely with prisoners of war. Meanwhile, on the fighting front - American forces were hard at work today, shoring **pa** up their defenses against enemy attack - on that treacherous eastern

Cambodian frontier.
