Henry Kissinger at the Kremlin. The U S

Brezhnev. The Soviet leader - expressing hope that  
we can reach a new strategic arms limitation agreement  
-- this year. ~~Whereupon~~ - Three hours of private talks.

~~On his own~~ Dr. Kissinger later observing that  
the U S and Russia - are both determined to overcome  
domestic opposition to the current detente. "This period  
of cooperation - has gained in strength and will continue"  
said he. Adding that the ~~primary~~<sup>major</sup> goal of the Nixon  
administration -- is to "make the relationship between  
our two peoples irreversible."

## WATERGATE

President Nixon today was given four more days -- in which to answer the latest subpoena from Special Watergate Prosecutor ~~Leon~~ Jaworski. This to permit the President's lawyer - to "evaluate the subpoena and make a judgment in terms of the ~~response~~ response."

In another facet of the same case - the deadline for a ~~be~~ final appeal came and went today at five o'clock Eastern time; and so ~~a~~ <sup>the</sup> special sealed report from the Watergate Grand Jury will be turned over to the House Judiciary committee ~~as of~~ tomorrow, ~~morning~~. ~~Said~~ <sup>This</sup> ~~report~~ <sup>s</sup> supposedly dealing with the President's handling of the whole Watergate case.
