domestic opposition to the current detente. "This period
of cooperation - has gained in strength and will continue"
said he. Adding that the ~~primary~~^{major} goal of the Nixon
administration -- is to "make the relationship between
our two peoples irreversible."

In another facet of the same case - the deadline for a ~~be~~ final appeal came and went today at five o'clock Eastern time; and so ~~a~~ ^{the} special sealed report from the Watergate Grand Jury will be turned over to the House Judiciary committee ~~as of~~ tomorrow, ~~morning~~. ~~Said~~ ^{This} ~~report~~ ^s supposedly dealing with the President's handling of the whole Watergate case.

ATHENS

For a change - students and soldiers were on the same side today in Athens. Thousands of each ~~participation~~ taking part in a giant parade -- marking the one hundred and fifty-third anniversary of the Greek War of Independence. President Ghizikis later laying a wreath - at ^{the Athens} ~~France's~~ tomb of the Unknown Soldier, ~~this~~ in front of the Greek Parliament building -- which is presently un-used.

LONDON
