Eight others rescued five hours later - from an area untouched by the blast. But the rest - still down there. Smoke, fire and the threat of additional explosions - temperarily precluding an immediate attempt to reach them. Hime efficials now saying it might take as much as ten days - to effect a full rescue.
