CAPE KENNEDY

Cape Kennedy - the countdown to Sunday passed the halfway mark today. No difficulties - right on schedule. The weather forecasters - also predicting good conditions; while the men of Apollo-Sixteen - were brushing up on their geology lessons. A space official saying, in $\mathbf{s u m}$ : "It looks good."

The lid that was clamped on Northern Ireland分
a couple of weeks ago - finally blew off today. IRA
terrorists mounting their worst campaign of shootings and
bombings - since the start of direct British rule. One of
the blasts killing an elderly woman - during a shopping
trip at Ballymoney, about forty miles northeast of Belfast.
In Belfast rets - a Catholic civil rightg $\int_{\text {group }}$
urged the IRA to stop the violence. This in a public
statement - with the Catholics adding: "Our Protestant
fellow countrymen - faced on one side with betrayal and on
the other side with IRA violence - are placed on the verge of despair; and it is in this despair" - the statement went on - "that evil men or fools can plant the seeds of civil war."

From the University of Connecticut - a new twist
to an old tale. Anthropologist William Laughlin -
discussing a thirty-year study of the Aleutians; confirming,
in part, the theory that Asian man crossed into the New

twenty-five thous and years ago; disputing, however, "the
romantic picture of stone-age man - taking aduntage of a
geologic accident to reach for another horizon."

In truth - says Laughlin - the "land bridge" in
question - was actually a thousand miles wide; prior to the
last great Ice Age - linking Asia and North American
"like great, continental Siamese twins." He adds, what's
more, this land mass "was a place of permanent habitation

- not a migratory route." And those who made it across
he contends - not really migrants, more like drifters.

WASHINGTON-SHREVEPORT
