President Ford today nominated Federal Judge

John Paul Stevens of Chicago to succeed retiring Justice

William O. Douglas on the Supreme Court. Stevens - fifty
five - is currently a member of the seventh U.S. Circuit

Court of Appeals in Chicago.

In making the announcement at a hastily called news conference on the eve of his trip to China, the President described Judge Stevens as the "best qualified person turned up by a thorough search." The nomination drew quick praise from the American Bar Association. A spokesman saying "Judge Stevens meets high standards of professional competence, judicial temperament and integrity." The Senate Judiciary Committee is expected to open confirmation hearings as soon as possible. A graduate of the University of Chicago and Northwestern Law School, Stevens was appointed a Federal circuit judge in Nineteen-Seventy by President Nixon. stevens likes to wear bow ties - is gray haired, and soft spoken, rated neither as a conservative nor a liberal.
