## WHITE HOUSE

The White House - President Nixon met privately today with his new second in command; and then Gerald Ford held his first Vice Presidential news conference at which he said:

"I can assure you the President has no intention whatesoever of resigning." The new Vice President then added: "I personally don't think he should resign." And he went on to say the President had assured him - "he would be completely exonerated" that "there will be no fair charge of involvement."

Gerald Ford then going on to say the President will continue to fight back by travelling around the country – holding news conferences and meeting with Congressmen. "But the real thing that will swing the pendulum back to faith in the President." said he, will be "accomplishments." If the President can bring about a real peace in the Mid-East

he continued - "there will be a ground swell of support."

ENERGY

On the energy front - the Senate today approved unanimously - a bill aimed at setting up a twenty billion dollar energy research and development program. It's goal that of making the U.S. self-sufficient in energy - by Nineteen-Eighty-Three.

Meanwhile a sharp drop today - in the number of highway blockades. But truckers were warning of more to come next week - unless the government moves quickly to ease the current truck fuel shortage. Geneva conference on the Middle East.

## UNEMPLOYMENT

The US unemployment ate -- only four up point five percent in October- back to four point seven last month. This due in part to a sudden increase of nearly two hundred thousand - in the total US labor force. Officials adding, however, the jobless figure will probably continue to climb - as fuel-related **unemp** unemployment begins to show up. MAIL

From Postmaster General E. Klassen a pledge today to do better this Christmas season. "We don't plan to get caught - like we did last year" - said he. Adding: "We are committed that on Christmas Eve December twenty-fourth our post offices will be free of mail." And this - he continued - a task made easier - by the fact that people really are mailing early. HOUSE

Congressman Rhodes of Arizona. Today succeeding Gerald Ford - by unanimous vote of House Republicans.

Rhodes later saying that "Pennsylvania Avenue - should **charg** always be a two way street." Adding that he hoped to "improve the level of

Congressional imput - into policy making."

He also observed that "the Watergate affair - needs to be cleared up". "I would hope" said he - ""Inter" the judiciary committee will proceed expeditiously on the impeachment question - and that we will have a definite vote on the floor; hopefully -

by march."

NASSAU

At Nassau in the Bahamas - a ruling today

that fugitive financier Robert Vesco - may not be Massau extradited to the US. Judge Emanuel Osadebay was forced to adopt the "same standard and practice as if the alleged offense were to have been committed in the Bahamas " Adding he was thus forced to conclude - there was "no evidence

to prove some essential elements" in the government's

case.

Former White House aide Dwight Chapin pleaded not guilty today- to charges that he lied to a Watergate Grand Jury. His trial - set for February <u>n</u>ineteenth.

Chapin later saying: "I have no sense of regret." "I only have a **dapp** deep desire" - he continued - "on behalf of my family, parents and friends - to see that the trial is brought forward quickly and my innocence proved." BRUSSELS

James Schlesinger of the US<sub>A</sub> the main

speaker today at ameeting of Nato Defense ministers

in Brussels. Schlesinger saying the Arab's recent success with Soviet **and** weapons and strategy in the Middle East should serve **and** as a warning to the West. Also, citing the success of massive reinforcement - by US and Russian air lifts.

Schlesinger's ultimate goal - that of charages strengthening Nato; not with greater contributions from the US - but more from Western Europe. He observed, however, that "some have not yet seen the necessity." "An illusion occurs occasionally over here" - he continued - "that somehow the American contribution could be eliminated - and still the <u>a</u>lliance would be militarily effective."
