Prevent them from intriguing - with the Reds. If his strategy is sound - Italy may have its strongest government since the war.

The rejection of the latest Soviet proposal
on Berlin -- was inevitable. The West, pointing out
that it's merely a rehash of Khrushcheves old propaganda
line. The Boss of the Kremlin has been calling for
West Berlin to be turned into - "a free city."

Now he uses the phrase -- "an independent state."

to become a member of the U N.
