

*After much controversy - including predictions of dire reaction - the Senate Intelligence Committee finally made public today - its report on alleged CIA assassination plots. The panel saying the CIA tried but failed to kill - Castro and Congo Premier Lumumba; in the early sixties - with underworld help.*

*The panel saying "We are unable to draw firm conclusions - concerning who authorized these plots; but there were drawn up - "by officials at the highest levels," under Presidents Eisenhower, Kennedy and Johnson.*

~~The committee also saying it "believes that short of war, assassination is incompatible with American principles." Adding: "It should be rejected - as a tool of foreign policy."~~
