A Cornell professor tells us - that Santa Claus was born right here - in the U.S.A. Yes sir, he's American, even if his home is at the North Pole! Back in Eighteen Nine, Washington Irving published his famous "Knickerbocker History." Washington Irvings's jolly tale of Christmas

was quoted far and wide - so far and wide that it soon was taken as an old legend - brought over from Holland. But here's the oddity: says the Cornell Professor: "I made a search through records dating back before Washington Irving's "Knickerbocker History," and was unable to find a single mention of the Dutch Christmas observances described by the author. So he concludes that Washington Irving was the mid-wife -- or should we say, the literary obstetrician who presided at the birth of the roly-poly, laughing Santa who is the central figure of Christmax as we know it. Santa Claus a one hundred percent American!
