Good Evening Everybody:

The chancellories of the world - East and

West - are studying a common subject tonight. Namely
Red China. From Washington to Seoul - from New Delhi

to Moscow - there's much concern about what Mao Tse
Tung will do next.

He's already been responsible for the recent killing of those American Idiers in South Korea.

The North Koreans have lined up with Peking - so no one doubts that Mao gave them the green light to commit atrocities below the truce line. In Washington and in Seoul, the fear is - that the strongman may step up the pressure on South Korea.

Meanwhile, New Delhi is looking toward - the Himalayas. Nehru believes that Mao may resume his offensive. Hence, Nehru's appeal for eq uipment - including Soviet rockets. Moscow reacting favorably.

Which means - according to some Kremlinologists - that

Mao has Khrushchev more worried than anybody. The Boss
of the Kremlin, most anxious to see the Chinese Reds
defeated in India - for fear that a victory would prompt
them to turn their legions against the border-lands
between Russia and Red China.

This would tie in with the latest Moscow attack - on Feking. Ahrushchev termin Mao - "A partner of the capitalistic war mongers". To which Mao retorts by calling ahrushchev - "A tool of western imperialism".

NUCLEAR

Republican reservations about the nuclear test ban treaty - are focused on the question of East Germany. What if the Soviet satellite - should also sign? Wouldn't that constitute - de facto American recognition of Ulbricht's puppet regime?

Senator Dirksen of Illinois - is pressing this argument. Which is why he's not expected to the join the congressional delegation - that will accompany the Secretary of State to Moscow.

House - denies that interpretation. He feels that an East
German signature on the document - would not imply any kind
of recognition by the other signatories. And Senator Mansfield
expects the congressional delegation - to be bi-partisan.
Both Democrats and Republicans - to watch as Dean Rusk
signs for the United States.

The British Prime Minister must be shuddering tonight

- as he reads the dispatches from Moscow. Dispatches telling

of another British defector - asking for asylum in the Soviet

Union. Harold Philby, the so-called "third man" in the

defection of Burgess and McLean more than a decade ago.

The Philby case could be a real blow - to the McMillan government. McMillan himself - when he was foreign Minister - gave Philby a clean bill of health. Denying that there was anything against the loyalty of - the man who has now gone to Moscow.
