Vice President Rockefeller today made the charge that the Soviet Union is attempting to build "a new empirein which the Soviet Sun never sets;" doing so by means of "a new and far more complex form of Imperialism - a mixture of Czarism and Marxism, plus colonial appendages." This in a speech at a meeting of the International Press Institute - at Philadelphia.

Nelson Rockefeller adding that "a positive and far closer partnership of independent nations - is essential" to combat the Soviet threat; to serve as a "counterpoise economically, militarily and politically - to the Soviet's expansionist thrust."

The new President elect of Lebanon, Elias Sarkis, was being given credit today for bringing to an end a fierce battle in the mountains northeast of Beirut. Sarkis is also said to be planning an appeal to Moslem leftists - for a national reconciliation and an end to Lebanon's thirteen year old civil war.

And now this message...

The leader of Britain's small but pivotal Liberal Party - today in London announced his reeignation. Jeremy Thorpe bowing to a storm of protest - over testimony in a court case that he once had a relationship with a male model. Thorpe again today denying he was guilty of any wrong doing. "But no man can lead a party" - said he - "if the greater part of his time has to be devoted to anwsering allegations and countering plots and intrigues."

The death toll in that Italian earth quake - continues
to climb. Officials at UDINE (you-dinay) today reporting

- more than eight hundred known dead. Adding that final
figure indeed could be over a thousand, with another thirteen
hundred - injured, and some sixty thousand left homeless;
most of whom are now living in "tent cities" - near the
ruins of their homes.
In a Hague newspaper - a report today that Prince

Bernhard of the Netherlands has been cleared of charges that he received payoffs from Lockheed Aircraft. A government study showing that the Prince received not one cent from Lockheed."

If the newspaper sources are correct, though the Prince "was acquainted with people who occasionally overstepped the mark - says the Hague story. Adding:

That "he must have known" - and if he didn't, he should have.

## CINCINNATI

Another attempt by James Earl Ray, convicted killer of Martin Luther King, to get a new trial was denied today in Cincinnati. A U.S. Appeals Court ruling that Ray's original guilty plea - "was entered voluntarily and knowingly." Adding that he's obviously trying to bargain and escape a death sentence.

One of America's first woman pilots - one of the "Early Birds" of flying - has passed away at Black
