Good evening everybody. This is Lowell Thomas for CBS News. Just back from Alaska, another brief visit to my favorite part of the world. And for some days now I have been rather overwhelmed by people on streets, in hotels, airports and so on, asking me about the adventure I had up north in a hotel fire. Incidentally, visiting Alaska has been a regular part of life for me for a period of over sixty years; and, it's the state where our only son, Lowell Jr., present majority leader of the Alaska Senate, also has been visiting and living in some thirty-four years.

As for hotel fire, at Juneau, for one thing, it resulted in the abrupt adjournment of a special session

of the Alaska legislature. This was because so many of the legislators were in the same hotel fire. There isn't time, this evening, for more on this; but now that I am back down in what Alaskans call the South Forty Eight, I hope I'll have a chance to tell you more about the fire from which I was lucky to escape; and, more important, tell you about what I saw and learned, up North.

Those eight black September terrorists convicted

yesterday of killing two Americans and a Belgian in

Khartoum - were flown to freedom today in Cairo. US

reaction - a statement of condemnation from Acting

Secretary of State Sisco; who said Sudanese President

Jaafar Numity had failed to live up to "repeated assurances

- that his case would be handled in a just manner." Adding:

"We are dismayed - we cannot accept he virtual release

of confessed murderers - as adequate punishment."

The present U.S. Ambassador to Sudan - was also instructed to return home "for consultations."

At Damascus - an attempt today to justify that overnight Arab terrorist attack - on the Israeli village of Nahariyya. A Palestinian guerrila spokesman saying:
"This operation was a quick reply" - to earlier Israeli raids into southern Lebanon.

From Jerusalem we hear more reprisals may be in the offing. Israeli premier Yitzhak Rabin saying that "Lebanon has the means - to prevent this terrorist activity;" and must "carry the responsibility."

The latest: Israeli heavy artillery reportedly opening fire tonight - on three border towns in Southwast Lebanon.

For President Nixon - the start of another

"journey for peace." The President flying today to

Brussels - for a meeting with fellow NATO leaders; and then

it's on to Moscow for the main event - the summit meeting

with Brezhnev.

The President setting his Kremlin's goals - in a brief airport speech. "First" - said he - "we expect to strengthen the bilateral relateral relations - between the two strongest nations in the world; second, we hope to dvelop areas of cooperation to displace confrontations in other areas of the world; and third, we hope to make more progress - in limiting the threat of nuclear weapons."

The President adding, in short, he intends "to make progress" on this long but vitally important journey - not only for America but for all mankind.

On arrival at Brussels when the President received a royal welcome from Belgium's King and Queen, he paid tribute to the "great principles" of the NATO alliance; calling NATO "indispensable in keeping peace in Europe - for the last twenty-five years."

Moscow today announced the successful launching of an unmanned Salyut space station. And - the Soviets are expected to launch a manned Soyuz spacecraft - to dock with the Salyut during the Nixon visit.

By a vote of twenty one to seventeen - the House

Judiciary Committee today killed a requested investigation

- of fellow congressmen. This in connection with campaign

contributions - from the nation's milk producers. The

seventeen supporting such an investigation - all Republicans;

the twenty one opposed - all Democrats.

The belauguered ruler of the Himalayan kingdom

of Sikkim - was among the missing today in Gangtok. King

Palden Thondup Namgyal - hurriedly flying to New Delhi to

appeal directly to Prime Minister Indira Ghandi - for a

restoration of some of his lost powers.

From Manila - a report today telling of three apparently coordinated Moslem rebel attacks - in the Southern Philippines. The biggest of these - at Cotabato; where the rebels were finally turned back - after losing an estimated one hundred and fifty to two hundred men.

The coming fashions for Fall and Winter - on display this week in New York. The new look for Geoffrey Beene - described as "loose, flowing, easy;" including an evening gown - made with thirty-seven yeards of chiffon.

A number of designers also featuring the style called, quote, "the big top." Nothing to do with the circus
- and doesn't imply any clowning around.
