A new wave of violence in Northern Ireland tonight - with mobs surging through the streets of Belfast and Londonderry - with said to be brink of Civil War. At least five personsdead in the streets of Belfast, one a young boy whet shot to death by an army sniper who claimed the lad was about to throw a firebomb. RThe government of northern Ireland - trying to stop the rioting - has ordered mass arrests and internment of citizens without trial - a move some say will surely lead to civil war between the Protestants and Catholics of northern Ireland. By nightfall, an estimated one hundred houses were burning in the Argoyne section of Belfast, Fires touched off by Protestants residents who say they burned their houses rather than surrender them to the Catholics. Army bulldozers moved through the streets - knocking down barricades - built with

bath tubs, kitchen tables, burned out cars, baby

carriages. The northern Ireland government blames

the new outbreaks on the outlawed Irish Republican

Army.

INDIA

The Soviet Union and Abso India surprised the diplomatic world today by signing a treaty of friendship and cooperation which - in effect guarantees Russian support for India in its troubles and presumably with China, with Pakistan, The twenty year pact pledges that Moscow and New Delhi would hold consultations on "appropriate and effective measures" if either is threatened or attacked. An Indian spokesman says the treaty is not aimed at any third country - although it's well known that Pakistan has accused India of aiding the rebels in East Pakistan - and, the Communist China has voiced sympathy for the Pakistani government in its efforts to keep East Pakistan in line.

More than a million Indians turned out for a gigantic rally in New Delhi today - in support of Prime Minister Indira' Gandhi's foreign and domestic Hotel policies. The imp huge demonstrations A held on the INDIA - 2

and Widl avenue spacious green lawns of Raj Path - the wide boulevard that leads to the Presidential Palace. Tenag with thousands of men, women and children marching four mirrows abreast along a nine mile work. Mrs. Gandhi - addressing the assembled throng from a fifteen foot high platform - urged all to support her government's policies.

TRUCKS

The Commerce Department today approved the export of more than one hundred sixty million dollars worth of foundry tools to the Soviet Union - tools the Russians will use to build the world's largest truck factory. Eventually, weire told, this will more than double the amount of U S exports to Russia and hopefully put some life in the sluggish smo American machine tool industry. The announcement apparently brought to ens and end a dead debate within the Nixon administration over whether we should make it easier for the Soviets to manufacture trucks that could be used for military purposes.

CARS

Two brand new American automobiles are, ready to be scrapped or the junk pille, in Moscow - after being smashed up by three local citizens wielding iron pix pipes. This way possibly in retaliation for the firebombing of a Soviet car in New York last week. The owners of the two cars - or what's left of them - are David Evans, and John Thompson - both second **secon** secretaries at the US Embassy, in Moscow, Evans - who has an eighth floor apartment in the diplomatic compound says he awoke early to the sound of crashing glass and crunching metal. Through his window he saw three men smashing his car + and Thompsons - the only American cars among eleven in the parking area. The US Embassy lodged a strong protest - and the two damaged cars were towed to the Embassy and left on the street outside - for everyone to see. Some Russian journalists claim the harrassment of

cities particularly by the Jewish Defense League which demands the free immigration of Russian be allowed to 20 Jews, to Israel.

SUBMARINES

South Carolina Senator Strom Thurmond says there are indications that Soviet nuclear missile submarines are being deployed from bases. on cuba - This, he says, violates the Nineteen Sixty-Two agreement between Russia and the United States, made reaching by President Kennedy and Premier Sen, Khrushchev. Although, Thurmond dian't disclose his information source, as a second ranking Republican on the Senate Armed Services Committee he presumably has access to intelligence data.
