LEXINGTON

On a pine dotted hill side at Lexington, Kentufky, the last rites today for Whitney Young, the fallen Civil Rights leader; including a moving me tribute from President Nixon.

The President saying: When others were asking what will the government do - Whitney Young was saying - what can I do -- to make this a better country through helping others.

The President further observed that Whitney Young's idea of America - was "one nation, indivisible, with liberty, justice and opportunity for all." And he added: "It is the responsibility of each of us - to help fulfill that dream that was in his heart."

WHITE HOUSE FOLLOW LEXINGTON

Later on - back at the White House - President Nixon signed into law today - that new ten percent across the board increase in Social Security benefits. But he also said that it's now up to Congress - to pass the legislation needed to help pay for it. Or failing that - said the President "we are faced with a very real prospect of immediate increasing inflation."

In the Middle East today -- Cairo - cautious approval of that new U S peace strategy -- as outlined yesterday by Secretary of State William Rogers. Western diplomats quoted as saying that Israel - is now "on the spot."

At the same time - a report that Jerusalem is perhaps ready to try a new tack. And this - we are told - an attempt to set aside major differences - in favor of negotiations on relatively minor differences. In other words - an attempt to me start at the bottom and work up.

ADD TO CAIRO JERUSALEM

Now this: Israeli Prime Minister Golda Meir taking strong exception to Rogers' border proposals. Madame Meir saying: "We cannot trust what Rogers offers us - even if he does say it with the best intentions. And she added: "This is not the border of the U S A but that of the Jewish people - and there are some points beyond which a nation cannot go."

In the war news from Laos - a report today that South
Vietnamese troops have now be abandoned that hill top artillery
base called "Lolo". The Bayen Saigon troops said to have
scrambled down a thousand foot cliff - just ahead of an
advancing column of Markhar North Vietnamese tanks. The
South Vietnamese later hacking their way through the jungle
attempting to reach the safety of another allied base at
nearby A-Luoi. An aerial bombardment from big U S B-52s
-- helping to cover the retreat.

Allied officials add headlesses However - that the Communists apparently paid a terrible toll for Lolo - losing more than eleven hundred men - as compared with with South Vietnamese losses set officially at sixteen. And the main reason according to one with South Vietnamese officer - the fact that Hanoi desperately needs "a psychological victory." Indeed, Viet Cong radio promptly announcing that the entire Laos drive "is now in bankruptcy."

From the pen of the late Charles DeGaulle - another volume of memoirs today - "the effort" - as it's called - dealing with France's domestic problems during the early sixties.

completed only two chapters - prior to his death. Nevertheless,
