Good evening everybody. The U.S. sets its sights on Mars - a manned landing on the Red planet - but not right off - not before the Nineteen-Eighties. That was the word late today from the White House - where President Nixon met with his special task force on space. The group submitted formal recommendations for our future manned space activities. It calls for a landing on Mars, but rejects any sort of crash program in that area. It also turns down any phasing - out of manned and un-manned activity, with that landing on Mars as an integral part. As to the timing - presidential news Secretary Ron Ziegler says "We are talking about the Nineteen-Eighties and beyond."

Another recommendation submitted to the President this one by a group of lawyers from the American Bar
Association. It proposes that the Federal trade commission
be abband abolished - unless it gets new leadership - and
dedicates itself to consumer protection, and enforcement of the

anti-trust laws. If change does not occur, the report says, there will be no substantial purpose to be served by continued existence of the Federal trade commission. It declares that Paul Rand Dixon should be replaced as FTC chairman.

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Coming soon - another big U.S. troop withdrawal from Vietnam. South Vietnamese Vice President Ky - first to signal the pending pullback. At a neusconference today in Saigon - setting the number of expected returness at forty thousand, five hundred. Adding that the figure could well reach two hundred thousand in all - by the end of next year. Ky asserting, what's more - the Americans will be replaced by South Vietnamese fighting men. And he added: "We think it is time - to take on more responsibilities.

Reaction to this in Washington - at first, guarded.

From all appearances - Ky apparently "jumping the gun" on U.S. officials. However, the White House finally declaring President Nixon will announce tomorrow a second round of troop withdrawals. Adding that "actual figures" - will be announced at that time.

Incidentally, the move delayed two weeks - we are told - because of that recent step-up in Communist military

At the United Nations - New York - Secretary General

U Thant - on the eve of another General Assembly
asserting that the world has been caught up - in the "made

momentum" of an arms race. One that increases "the threat

of nuclear war" - with every passing day. Adding that it must

be ended - if we are ever "to fashion a world free from fear."

In the same vein - the Secretary General calling Red China's current state of quarantine - "a tragedy" in world affairs. He further urged a restoration - of "normal, if not cordial," relations between Washington and Peking. U Thant saying: "The association of all five nuclear powers" - is ar "indispensable step" in any disarmament talks.
