MINNEAPOLIS

At the midwestern governor's conference in Minneapolis - a panel discussion today on the world food crisis. Nobel prize-winning scientist Norman Borlaug - telling of unconfirmed reports of extensive damage to Russia's winter wheat crop. If true - said he - "this means we are on pretty thin ice." Borlaug adding that, indeed, the world's total grain reserves - are now down to a twenty-seven day supply.

After much debate but far less than before - the House Judiciary Committee today approved a third article of impeachment; urging the removal of President Nixon from office - for having refused the Panel's request for nearly a hundred and fifty White House tapes.

Article Three - offered by Congressman McClory of Illinois, a Republican; ~~was~~ ^{was} approved ~~by a~~ ^{vote} twenty-one to seventeen; with McClory and Congressman Hogan of Maryland - the only Republicans voting in favor. This following Republican charges - that Article Three was "utterly without merit;" in the words of Congressman RAILSBACK of Illinois - *It was* an attempt at "political overkill."

The formal presentation was made - by the President's lawyer, James St. Clair; who added that a "significant portion" of the remaining subpoenaed tapes - would be available by Friday.

Burns saying the demand for available money - "is still too high for the stability of average prices." Adding that the ~~gov~~^{Reserve} will be forced to continue its high interest rates - until "the fires of inflation burn themselves out."
