It looks as if Soviet Russia were going to put all # its diplomatic strength behind the drive against Franco Spain. This was indicated tonight by Radio Moscow, which blasted against Franco and demanded action by the United Nations. The Soviet propaganda street said in the strongest terms that the Franco regime was a menace to peace - an international matter, not merely the internal business of the Spandards. And Radio Moscow reiterated the charge that Franco is harboring German scientists in researches to produce new weapons - including the atomic bomb.

This would seem to mean that Poland, having brought the Franco problem before the Security Council, will step aside more or less and let Soviet Russia carry the ball, and quite a backy ball-carrier the Societs are, with plenty of bulk and brawn, for plunging though the line. Lange of Poland is likely to yield the

limelight to Gromyko of Moscow - when the question of Spain comes up before the Security Council next week.

Great Britain seems to be trying to find some way out of the Security Council showdown on Franco -Britain taking the view that Spain's government, right new, is Spain's own internal problem. And the United States has groken with a similar voice Pfrom London we have word of a British-American-French confabulation. This was predicted today in the London News Chronicle Verson Bartlett, who is in an article both an W.P. and a journalist. He states that British, American and French representatives are going to meet In London for a round table discussion of what to do about Franco. The inclusion of France is significant because the government at Paris, with its powerful Communist element, has been insistently demanding action.

Meanwhile, the Franco government has denied the charge that it is fostering German scientists in warlike researches - like atomic bomb researches. The Franco regime offers to let United Nations diplomats and foreign newsmen investigate and hunt for over Spain for signs of atomic received. And, curiously

enough, this line of denial is echoed by anti-Franco

Spanish Republicans in France. They say there is nothing
to the stories about German scientists working on

atomic bombs in Spain. Today the official Spanish

Republican headquarters in Paris stated that the

allegations are, in its words, "without foundation."

√On the other hand, a Number One leader of the Spanish anti-Franco exiles, Dr. de Los Rios, charges that Franco is mustering military power against France. He stated that four hundred and fifty thousand Spanish troops have been concentrated in menacing fashion on the French border - maybe for a blow against France. | "Spain," declared the Spanish Republican leader, "now has an army superior to that of France numerically, and perhaps in the quality of armament, too. " And he charged Franco with nursing what he called, "an aggressive spirit and an aggressive plan against France."

proceedings against the Franco government. If Spain is
invited to present harmans a defense to the Security
Council - no attention will be paid to that. Such is
the gist of an announcement made by the Spanish Embassy
which states that Spain will boycott the whole
thing.

At the Nuremberg trial Ernest Kaltenbrunner, who was director of the Hitler Security Police, went into frenzie denial today. He was confronted with damning evidence of atrocity - including evidence that an execution exhibition had been arranged for him, a special william show for his em benefit. He shouted, "No" to everything, even denying his own signature on a letter ordering anti-Semitic atrocities.

Meanwhile, strange stories about the Nuremberg trial are circulating in Germany - and even drifting to other countries. This, says today's news dispatch, is a result of censorship. With Allied military censorship clamped on tight in Germany, rumor takes the place of published news - and there is no way of killing a phoney story. If it is officially denied, the Germans merely think that the censorship is hiding something.

The rumor crop centers around chief defendant goering. All sorts of things are said to have happened

to him in court - all the way from an epileptic fit to shooting. The fact is that Goering, appearing in court day after day, is in the best of health. But, it's impossible to down reports throughout Germany that Hitler's one-time Number Two man is desperately ill, wounded, or dead.

The most astonishing yarn tells of a shooting affray in the Nuremberg courtroom - a wild brawl with pistol fire, among the international figures. According to this, the stately British judge, Lord Chief Justice Lawrence was presiding, garbed in his majestic black robe of the when Goering was being questioned by Chief Soviet Prosecutor General Rudenko. The questioning got so hot that it turned into a free-for-all, with the Soviet General pulling a gun and blazing way at Goering killing him. 'st to make the story complete -Lord Chief Justice Lawrence, in the middle of the excitement, reached

out down under his black robe and pulled, a pistol. If so, it's the most undignified thing that a Lord Chief Justice of England has done in a long time!

Yugoslavia turns down the proposal that American soldiers be permitted to testify in behalf of General Mikhailovitch, famed as the leader of the Chetniks.

The regime headed by Communist Marshal Tito declares that the leader who led the first resistance to the Nazis in Yugoslavia will be it tried and presumably condemned without the benefit of American evidence.

Yugoslavia states that there cannot be any discussion of whether or not Mikhailovitch is guilty.

"His crimes," says the statement, "are far too big and horrible."

That would seem to seal the doom of General Mithailovitch, whom the regime of Tito's Communists accuses of pro-Nazi collaboration, after having led the Chetniks in battle against the Nazis.

PALESTINE

News from Jerusalem tells of a new crisis in Palestine - and, at the same time, gives us a revealing flash into the depths of religious and historic perplexit out there in the Holyland.

The crisis arises with the Jewish feast of the Passover - this coming weekend. With the stirring of ancient memories, Zionist fervor is redoubled - as is the resentment of the Zionists against the British. This, of course, is because of British restrictions on Jewish immigration in Palestine - and, as Passover comes, with 'ts religious and nationalist ardors, there is a particular case of immigration-restriction on which Zir ist resentment is focused. The case, that is, of the Italian ship at the port of Spezia, which is found to be crowd... with fourteen hundred Jewish refugees, who are or the way to Palestine, to be smuggled in. Today's news from Italy states that three British officers of Jewish

descent have been arrested, charged with having planned the unauthorized voyage. They are said to have arranged for the refugees to go to the ship and to have accompanied them.

In Palestine, the Eienist reaction to this incident is vigorous and drastic. On the eve of Passover, six hundred thousand Zionists will stage a one-day strike-in protest. And other strikes are now in progress - or are threatened.

Richard the Lion Hearted failed to conquer Jerusalem, but he waged such valiant battle that he obtained concessions from Saladin, the Moslem King. One of these was r guarantee that "hristian pilgrims should be allowed freely to make their pious visits to Jerusalem and the Holy Places. / A reminder that Jerusalem is sacred also to the Christians X Saladin was apprehensive about the pilgrimage rights he had granted. He was afraid that the gras Christians might throng in such numbers that they'd be able to seize Jerusalem. That is, at Easter 'time , the great season for pilgrimage to forusale in those days.

So he instituted the counter-pilgrimage, when

Moslems would flock into Jerusalem - Fosts of them to counter-balance the numbers of Christians. This counter-pilgrimage he dedicated to Moses, the feast of Nebi Mussa.
