The Big Three want to hold discussions with the Soviets. So stated by the three Ministers, Secretary of State Dulles, the Marquis of Salisbury, and French Foreign MinisterBidault. They have just ended a five day meeting - in which they discussed some of the major international problems, They exchanged views on the war in French Indo-China, and on unificationof Germany. They declared that their nations will hex stand by the South Koreans in case of another Red invasion. But their most important pronouncement - the leaders of the Big Three should meet with Malenkov - that is, they want a meeting if Malenkov has not been purged beforehand.

In Korea, the fighting grows fiercer all the time. This Red attack -- the biggest in two years.

About one hundred thousand Chinese, smashing at South Korean defenses, along the central and western fronts.

planes, have caused heavy casualties among the Chinese.

President Eisenhover's special envoy, Walter

possible. In Robertson's words: "Nothing agreed upon
is inconsistent with an immediate implementation of
the truce."

No wonder that Syngman Rhee is becoming more conciliatory in dealing with the U.W. His troops are fighting tremendous battles with the enemy - and the obviously to his advantage to have an armistice before his forces are destroyed.

Today Czechoslovakia was bombarded mm from western Germany. The bombardment - thousands of balloons drifting across the border - behind the Iron Curtain. They carried appeals to the Czech people - to oppose the Red regime that rules them. The whole thing, part of a propaganda war - taking advantage of those difficulties that the Soviets have run into imfastern Europe.

The balloons were released by an American organisation called "crusade for freedom". The balloons soring high into the sky, and carried by strong winds deep behind the Csech frontier. They reexpected to land at different spots in Csechoslovakia - spots like the great cities of Prague and Pilsen.

According to the American radio, this bombardment will go on for several days, releasing some twelve million messages - one for each citizen of Csechoslovakia

The use of balloon "bombardments" is not new. It has been used twice in the past - against Poland and Czech slovakia. That was back in Nineteen

Fifty-One. This latest operation is described as four times larger than either of the previous ones.

The messages are of three types. One, a Csechoslovak bank note - carrying an appeal to the Cseche to oppose the Rece. Second, a pamphlet explaining the riots in East Germany, and also the fall of Beria. The last type of message - an aluminum coin stamped with with the slogan "all Cseche and Slovaks for freedom - all the free world for the Cseche and Slovaks."
